TO THE RESCUE 2! March 16, 2014

Romans 5:6-8—“Christ died for us while we were still weak. We were living against God, but at the right time, Christ died for us. Very few people will die to save the life of someone else. Although perhaps for a good man someone might possibly die. But Christ died for us while we were still sinners. In this way God shows His great love for us.”

1 Fuel Up – Today in Treasure Cove we resumed our series of lessons learning about God’s Rescue Mission; His plan of redemption for us!

Have you ever noticed how much money people spend on the things they really value? What about you? What are you willing to pay a high price for because of its value to you? Are there things you think have too high a price? Are any of these high priced ‘things’ really valuable even if they aren’t valuable to you?

What about people, are they valuable to you? Most of us place a high value on the people who matter the most in our lives, but we don’t always value people we don’t know. And even fewer of us value people we consider our enemies.

God is different than us. He values every one of us— even those who don’t know Him yet. In fact, we are each so valuable to Him that He sent Jesus to pay a high price for our redemption before we even knew we needed to be forgiven from our sins. He sent Jesus as a sacrifice for us.

The high value God places on us doesn’t come from anything we do. It doesn’t matter to Him if we are the fastest, smartest or most beautiful person. God values us because we are His children. Once we recognize this value in everyone we meet—we’ll know how God wants us to value and care for one another!

Have you ever done something nice for someone else? Who was it for and what did you do?

What would you say is the most valuable thing in your life? Why?

Would you be willing to give up the most valuable thing in your life? Why or why not?
