# 1 Casting off – Ahoy Treasure Cove families—a Merry Christmas and Happy New Year to you on our final Treasure Cove service of 2014!

All of us have people we need to obey and follow if we want to live peaceful, productive lives. Usually these authorities want us to obey because they are watching out for us and they want the very best for us just like a good parent wants the best for their child. But sometimes the people we follow don't really care about us. They don't really know what is best for us or they aren't trustworthy people.

The good news is that we can respect our authorities and still choose God as the ultimate authority for our lives. God is not like any other person we follow. He is all-powerful and sovereign and we can trust Him completely. God always knows and wants the very best for us.

When we choose to give Him authority over our lives, we will find that things will go better for us. And God will also help us recognize the good authorities He places in our lives; the people who do want what is best for us, the people we should listen to and obey.

It was a great way to reflect on the reason we celebrate and give gifts at Christmas time—because God gave us the greatest gift of all time, Jesus!
