Jesus wants us to be holy as He is holy!

October 4th, 2015

Rev 3:1 “To the angel of the church in Sardis write: These are the words of him who holds the seven spirits of God and the seven stars. I know your deeds; you have a reputation of being alive, but you are dead. **Rev 3:2** Wake up! Strengthen what remains and is about to die, for I have found your deeds unfinished in the sight of my God. **Rev 3:3** Remember, therefore, what you have received and heard; hold it fast, and repent. **Rev 3:5** Those who are victorious will, like them, be dressed in white. I will never blot out their names from the book of life, but will acknowledge their names before my Father and his angels.”

#1 Casting off – Ahoy parents and other grownups! We are excited to welcome you and your wee ones to another amazing season in Treasure Cove.

Last week Pastor Marcus introduced the Treasure Cove characters (and they are some real characters), before the drama began. He explained how they are representative of us on our spiritual walk, and explained that as we watch them cope with the situations they face, we can discover spiritual truths God wants each of us to know and be able to apply in our own lives.

Today we talked about Christ's rebuke to the Church at Sardis. Christ's desire is that we be holy as he is holy.

We talked about holiness being ‘set apart’ or ‘unpolluted’. Sadly, sin pollutes our lives and only through confession, repentance, trust and obedience to Jesus can that sin be ‘knocked out’ of our lives.

Jesus desires that we live lives that are pure—unpolluted by worldly things—and He gives us the strength and power to live this holy life!

QUESTIONS TO DISCUSS:

Who did the wrong thing in Treasure Cove?
(The Professor)

What did that person do?
(He stole Mrs. Stifleman's rubidium pot)

Who did it hurt?
(It hurt Mrs. Stifleman because she trusted him. It also hurt the Professor, because his selfish sin hurt his relationship with Mrs. Stifleman and separated him from God.)

What did the professor need to do to ‘get rid’ of his sin?
(He needed to ask for forgiveness from Mrs. Stifleman and confess his wrong to Jesus and ask Jesus to cleanse his heart)

What are ways we can draw closer to Jesus and be like Him?

(Some examples are: Love Jesus the most; obey Jesus; love others first; read the Bible; pray; help others; be kind; share; etc.)
