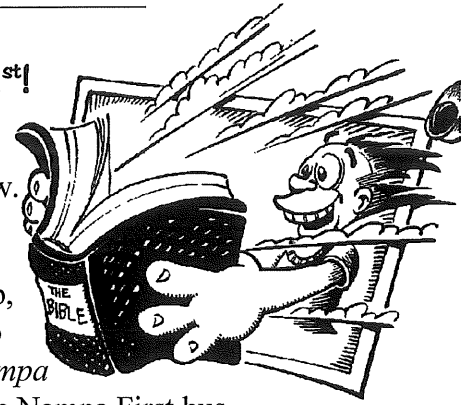


4TH - 6TH GRADE CAMP BUCKS

You can earn most of your way to camp through Camp Bucks! Camp Bucks are earned by completing Bible Memory and/or Bible Reports as specified below.



Pre-Registration Instructions:

If you intend to pre-register & want to use Camp Bucks to help pay for camp, then you **MUST bring in the following by April 1st**: 1) a completed Camp Registration Form; 2) \$25 in cash or check (*Checks must be made out to Nampa 1st Church*); and 3) \$25 worth of Camp Bucks, and 4) \$5 if you are riding the Nampa First bus.

Camp Bucks Instructions:

1. Memorize **and/or** read & write reports on the Scripture passages outlined below. (*Make arrangements with Pastor Marcus to recite memorized scripture.*)
2. **YOU MUST GO IN ORDER!!** (*Example: #1 Books of the Bible memorized & recited BEFORE #2 Jeremiah 29:11-13; or, James 3 read and report completed BEFORE Isaiah 53 is started.*)
3. A TOTAL of \$125 in Camp Bucks may be earned by combining memory & reading reports.
4. The **FINAL** deadline to turn in all Camp Buck work is the Wednesday before your camp! (*But if you want to pre-register before April 1st, be sure to have AT LEAST \$25 of Camp Buck work completed.*)

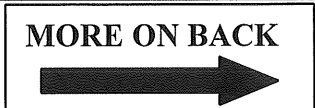
