A key element of a chaplain's qualifications and qualities for service with a law enforcement agency is his or her willingness to be actively involved in training programs offered by ICPC and by law enforcement agencies.

Training programs enhance a chaplain's efficiency in meeting and dealing with people in crisis. Many clergy are either required or strongly encouraged by their ecclesiastical organizations to participate regularly in continuing education programs.

The Annual Training Seminar (ATS) offered by ICPC specifically is intended to prepare law enforcement chaplains for their specialized work.

The required 12 core courses for credentialing at the Basic level of law enforcement chaplaincy will be offered, as well as an Advanced Track and Enrichment Courses. ICPC Regions also offer course work to satisfy many of the basic credentialing requirements.

ICPC MAINTAINS A REGISTRY OF ALL CONTINUING EDUCATION WORK COMPLETED BY MEMBERS. EACH OF THE WORKSHOPS OR ADVANCED TRACK PROGRAMS AT THE NA-TIONAL ATS WILL EARN EACH PARTICIPANT CONTINUING EDUCATION CREDITS.

### **ICPC REGION 8 TRAINING OPPORTUNITY**

The Sevierville, TN Police Department is hosting a training opportunity for Police Chaplains and Officers during January 9-12, 2023. Training will begin at 8:00 AM on Monday and conclude by mid-afternoon on Thursday. Two tracks of training will be offered. First, PEER SUPPORT FOR CHAPLAINS AND OFFICERS will be taught by Tim Rutledge. This course will take the entire 4 days of training. 40 participants maximum. Second, ICPC BASIC 12 COURSES will be taught by certified ICPC instructors. 30 participants maximum. Either track will qualify for ICPC credit.

We have arranged with a local Hampton Inn, 681 Winfield Dunn Parkway, Sevierville, TN 37876 - (865-429-2005) near the training site for a special rate of \$96 per night. A breakfast is included in this rate. Because of the early start time on Monday, participants will need to arrive on Sunday, January 8, 2023. The hotel is holding 25 rooms at this rate until December 31, 2022. After that date, the rate will still be offered provided rooms are available. To reserve your room, contact the hotel directly, and give them the code: ICPC. Ask for General Manager Marise Greear.

### "Get our Six" Campaign

The International Conference of Police Chaplains mission is "Developing professional chaplains through dynamic education and support". I believe in the mission and have received hundreds of hours of quality law enforcement chaplaincy training. All the while developing lifelong friends through the fellowship at Annual and Regional Training Seminars for the past 50 years.

Generally, we will throw our support behind something or someone we believe who supports our mission. Support may be with our time, voice, or money. I have tried to do all three.

ICPC desires to continue to be the cutting edge of law enforcement chaplaincy. The only way that can be accomplished is by investing funds in development and programs.
