### **Davenport Hotel Historic Presentation**

Grand Again! It was the first hotel with air conditioning, the first hotel with a central vacuum system, the first hotel to employ dividing walls in its ballrooms and the first hotel to sell Crab Louis. It was "one of America's exceptional hotels" when it opened in September of 1914. Closed in 1985 and dark for 15 years, The Davenport Hotel was all but forgotten, almost destroyed, until local entrepreneurs, Walt and Karen Worthy stepped in to save the entire city block. Two years and 35 million later, the lobby and ballrooms have been restored to their original grandeur while the guest rooms and service areas are all brand new. Named for its first proprietor, Louis Davenport, the hotel endeavors earnestly to so well please it's guests that they will be "glad they came, sorry to leave and eager to return."
