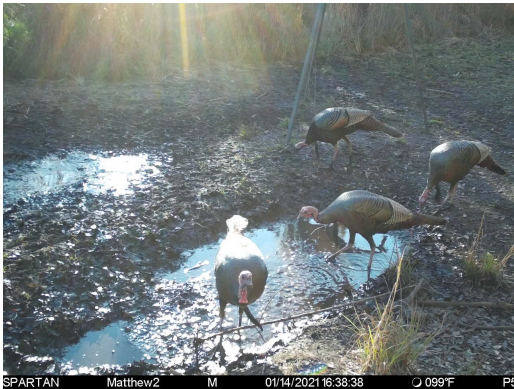

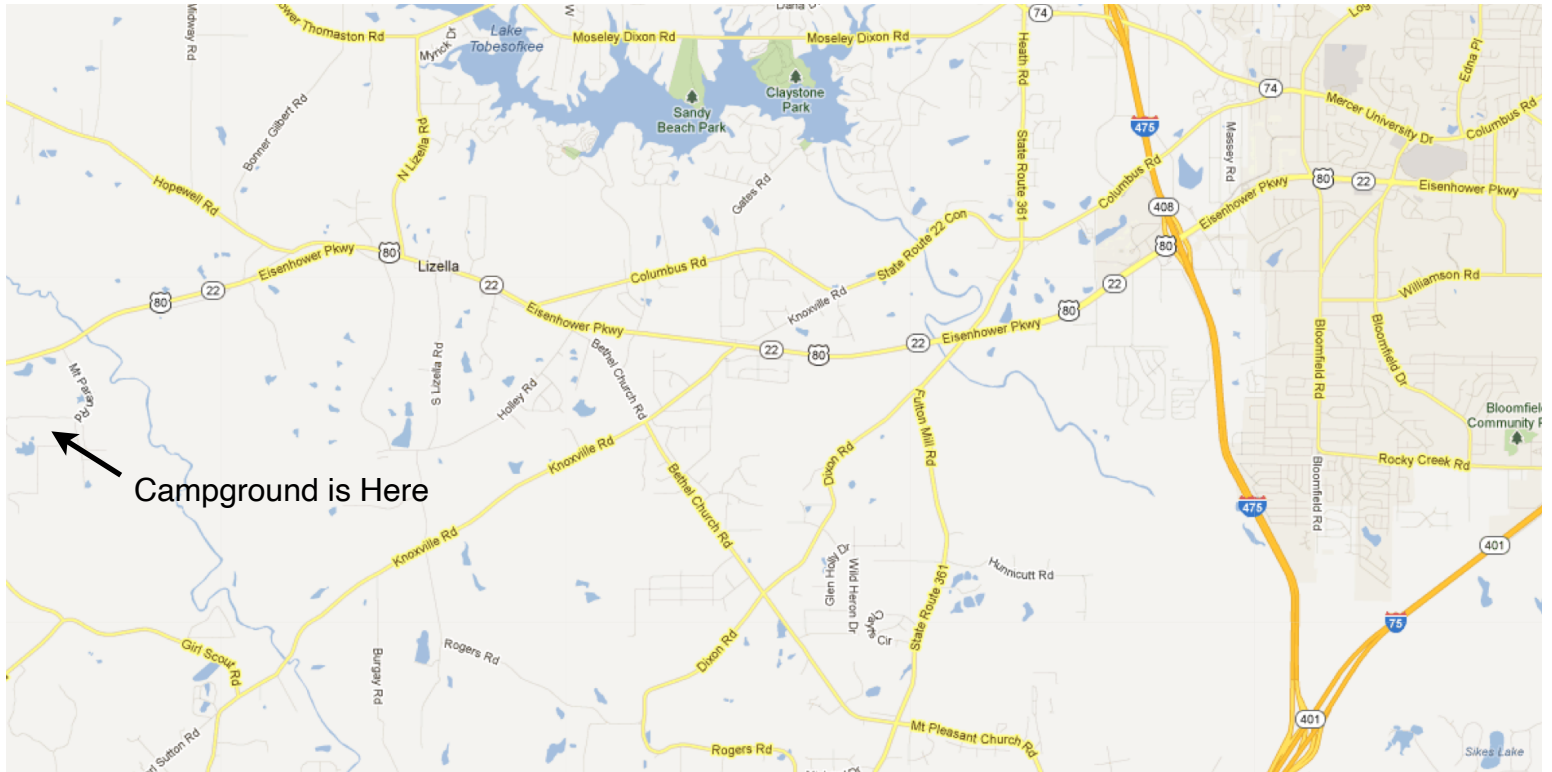

Pinewood Derby Rules

I. Stock Car

1. The car should be **newly built for the current year**. **Stock Division cars must use Official Pinewood Derby Car Kits from Boy Scouts of America**. The contestant racing the car should substantially build the car. Parental or leader supervision in the construction of the car is encouraged.
2. **Weight** - The total weight of the car may not exceed 5.0 ounces. The official race scales used at car check in shall be considered final. Weight may be added to the car and will be considered part of the car for purposes of all measurements. "Weight" is considered to be any material on the car that is not provided in the kit. All weight must be securely fastened to the car, e.g. by permanent glue, nails or screws.
3. **Car Dimensions** - Overall length of the car shall not exceed 7 inches. The overall width of the car shall not exceed 2 3/4 inches. The car must have 1 3/4 inch clearance between the wheels. The car must have 3/8 inch clearance underneath the body to not rub on the track.
4. **Wheels** - **Official BSA wheels and axles must be used**. You may sand the seams and imperfection from the wheels but may not drill holes in the wheels. The wheels must maintain the original width. The wheels must be attached to the car using the axles.
5. **Lubrication** - dry lubricant may be used such as graphite powder to lubricate wheels, and the new style wet lube may be used sparingly. Once the car is impounded, it may NOT be re-lubricated.
6. The motion of the car may not be mechanically aided (motor, springs, rubber bands, etc. are prohibited).
7. There must be no moving parts on the car. This includes bearings, bb's or moving weights. If this is found a car could be disqualified.
8. **Note: rule changes have been made to simplify and support further work and ingenuity on the cars. This has been done to reinforce delayed gratification. The harder you work on your car the better it will perform.**

The Georgia COGOP Parley Pinewood Derby Chairman or his appointed replacement may disqualify any car that in their determination is not in compliance with the spirit of the Pinewood Derby.

2. Modified Division

Rules for modified division shall be the same as stock with the following exceptions:

1. Any wheels and axles may be used and may be modified in any way except that they may not be mechanically aided in any way (motor, springs, etc.)
2. Any axles may be used.

2022 Great Cardboard Boat Race Rules

Teams & Racing Format

- 1. Racing team will consist of 2 members in boat.**
- 2. Boat Race is for Discovery, Adventure and Expedition age groups.**
- 3. Racers must provide their own and wear personal flotation devices.**
- 4. Race must begin and end with 2 person crew intact.**
- 5. Swimming and/or pulling the boat will result in disqualification.**
- 6. Awards will be presented for 1st 2nd and 3rd. Best design and Titanic award.**
- 7. Titanic Award is first boat to sink but must travel a minimum of 10 feet.**
- 8. Each church can enter multiple boats per age group.**

Boat Design

- 1. Boat must be built of cardboard and duct tape only and may have one piece of styrofoam 4'x4'x2". No glue is permitted.**
- 2. Boats should be constructed before Parley and not on sight.**
- 3. All boats will be inspected at time of race for rules compliance.**
