# Letter from the Editor

## "The Authority of Jesus"

I read a story the other day regarding a certain Army man who had been a heavy drinker for 35 years. Finally, he encountered Christ and his whole life changed.

He was speaking once before a group of medical people. He told them of his life changing experience. Challenged by a psychiatrist, who believed that personalities are so firmly set in early life that no one can change, he protested to the Colonel that at his age a person could not have such a radical transformation.

"Well," replied the Colonel, "that may be true. But I am under new management - I answer to another authority - the highest and truest there is." Excerpt from Traditional

Mark 1:21-28

21And they went into Capernaum; and straightway on the Sabbath day he entered into the synagogue, and taught.

22And they were astonished at his doctrine: for he taught them as one that had authority, and not as the scribes.

23And there was in their synagogue a man with an unclean spirit; and he cried out,

24Saying, Let us alone; what have we to do with thee, thou Jesus of Nazareth? Art thou come to destroy us? I know thee who thou art, the Holy One of God.

25And Jesus rebuked him, saying, Hold thy peace, and come out of him.

26And when the unclean spirit had torn him, and cried with a loud voice, he came out of him.

27And they were all amazed, insomuch that they questioned among themselves, saying, What thing is this? What new doctrine is this? For with authority commandeth he even the unclean spirits, and they do obey him.

28And immediately his fame spread abroad throughout all the region round about Galilee.

I wonder what it must have been like to witness Christ controlling the wind and waves just by His voice. To watch people as they were instantly healed from blindness, leprosy and other afflictions. To listen as Christ spoke to the dead and commanded them back to life.

Hopefully as you read this you are reminded of times in your life that you have witnessed miraculous healings. Others may be reading with a more skeptical view. The fact is that most people are going to believe what they have always believed regardless of the facts. But something different occurred in the life of Jesus. Mark records that when Jesus came to Capernaum, on the Sabbath day, and entered the synagogue and taught, the crowds were astounded. Why? One word: Authority. He taught, not as the scribes taught, but as one having authority.

What separated Christ from the other teachers of His day, one word—"authority"?

*I don't believe the church's problem is not that we do not have authority, but rather that we don't use the authority that we have. It is time that we quit defining the problems of the world, developing new methods and ministries to meet those needs but rather begin applying the power of the church to the problems.*

Jesus clearly instructed us that He alone was the way. We have no authority in ourselves; it is Christ's authority working through us.

The man with an unclean spirit knows exactly who Jesus is. The Disciples had not figured it out yet, that would come later. This man asks the same question that the world asks the church "What are you going to do with people like me?"

Christ commanded authority over the very thing the Church of that day could only define as "unclean". We don't need to understand or even define all of the problems of the world. We simply need to command the authority of Christ in order to deliver them from it. When I go to a Doctor I don't necessarily need to understand what is wrong with me, I know my symptoms. I don't want the Doctor to explain it to me; I want the Doctor to make me better.

After the people witnessed this divine miracle that they couldn't explain, they chose rather to concentrate on the fact that it was a "new" teaching rather than the miracle that had been performed.

I'm not against new methods, great teaching and preaching, although 1 Corinthians 1:21 places it all into perspective: "For after that in the wisdom of God the world by wisdom knew not God, it pleased God by the foolishness of preaching to save them that believe". 1 Corinthians 1:21. I believe too many times we hide behind our "new" teaching and a method because we lack the authority and power to achieve what really needs to be accomplished.

"And I will give unto thee the keys of the kingdom of heaven: and whatsoever thou shalt bind on earth shall be bound in heaven: and whatsoever thou shalt loose on earth shall be loosed in heaven". Matthew 16:19

Take a look at your keys. Those keys bring you ownership, power and authority to open doors, operate equipment and lock things. Christ has done the same thing. As we experience this wonderful Spring of "new life" that is ushering in Easter, let us be reminded that the church has been given access to the authority of Jesus. Let us go forth with His deliverance in our hands and change this world.

# V A C O G O P M E N S M I N I S T R Y

Recently I was ask by our State Overseer, Bishop Wayne Murphy, if I would consider being Virginia's State Men's Director. He then explained to me how that Bishop Douglas D. Milliner had agreed with our former State Overseer, Bishop Robert Davis, that he would take the office of Virginia's Men Director for only three years. I think everyone would agree with me that Brother Milliner has done an awesome job for the past three years. The attendance at our Spring Men's Retreat has grown every year. God has richly used Brother Milliner to bless our men in Virginia under his leadership, and I pray for the favor of God to be upon my life, as this mantle has now been passed to me.

I feel so unworthy. I told Brother Murphy, "I did not know what a Men's Director was suppose to do, but I do know the One who does, and I do know how to ask Him. I am a good beggar!" After that day the burden for our men of Virginia has fell upon my shoulders, and has consumed me with a passion.

I want God to use me to build and equip men to be like "Acts 6:3 MEN." "Therefore, brethren, seek you out among you, MEN of good reputation, full of the Holy Spirit and wisdom, whom we may appoint over this business (NKJV)." We have lost a generation in the past and we cannot afford to lose another generation, or we will be closing the doors on some of our churches. It is not pretty to show our dirty laundry to others, but our churches, our pastors, our wives, and our children are crying for MEN FULL OF THE HOLY GHOST and wisdom, that have a good reputation. By God's grace, I wish to see this breach repaired.

I recently went to the funeral of a dear friend of mine. As I talked with some of his relatives, I found a friend that had went to our Youth Camp several years ago, at the same time as I. We talked about the many different stories of our past camp days. As we talked about all of our old friends that we had together, and as we laughed, remembering the joy of getting into mischief. The question was repeatedly asked, "Where is \_\_\_\_\_ at now?" As this question was asked over, and over, my heart begin to break as I realized WE HAD LET A GENERATION SLIP THROUGH OUR FINGERS. Even the one that I was talking with was no longer a Christian. About 90% of the people that we had talked about were no longer attending our church, and the majority were not saved any more.

Then I remembered Brother Milliner telling the importance of reaching men for Christ. Win 100 children to Christ – get 3.5 new families in church. Win 100 women to Christ – get 17 new families in church. Win 100 MEN to Christ – get 93 new families in church. When the Philippian jailer questioned Paul and Silas, "What must I do to be saved?" The answer given was, "Believe on the Lord Jesus Christ, and you will be saved, you and your household. And he rejoiced, having believed in God with all his household (Acts 16:30-34)."

Even a boxer is trained to hit the head. The trainer knows that wherever the head goes, the body will follow. If each of our churches won 50 new men to Christ and their families followed them... then all would have to start a new building program. What am I saying? GET THE MAN!!! We cannot afford to lose another generation! Jesus chose us to bear fruit, and that our fruit should remain (John 15:16). JESUS FIRST CHOSE MEN... GET THE MAN, and you will get the family back.

## A HIRELING OR A SHEPHERD?



John 10:11-15 I am the good shepherd: the good shepherd giveth his life for the sheep. But he that is an hireling, and not the shepherd, whose own sheep are not, seeth the wolf coming, and leaveth the sheep, and fleeth: and the wolf catcheth them, and scattereth the sheep. The hireling fleeth, because he is an hireling, and careth not for the sheep. I am the good shepherd and know my sheep, and am known of mine.

As we read this passage of scripture the old familiar phrase “it’s NOT my job”, really stands out. The hireling did not take ownership of his sheep- because they really were not his sheep, or it wasn’t really his job! How sad that today we have people just filling a place, until something better comes along.

We have some wonderful youth leaders and ministers in Virginia and in the church across the country, but we need more leaders to rise to the challenge of filling roles as Shepherds and NOT hirelings. The challenge is going out today and this is the call from the Great Shepherd! Are you willing to sacrifice for your sheep? Are you willing to go the extra mile? A true shepherd after God’s heart will care, protect, love and nurture his sheep. He will guide his sheep and let them know when they are straying too close to the edge. Do you have the courage to protect your sheep from the “wolves of society”?

Praise God for the sheep and shepherds that God is leading and directing thru the hills and valleys, the green pastures and Heavenly places. 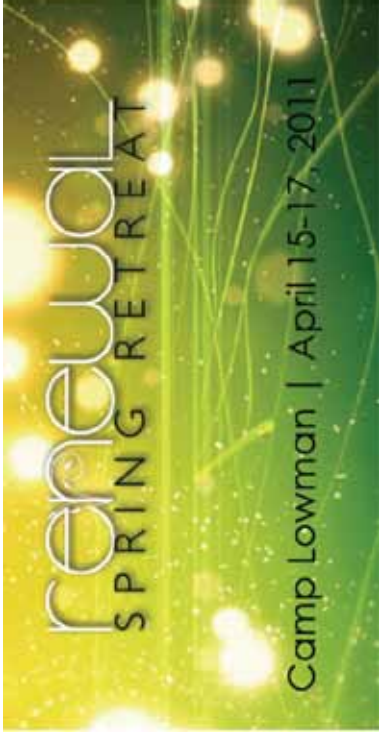
