

The Visionary Ministry hosted its annual brainstorming session on 3 June 2017. This intentionally designed session was created to help solicit information from all members on topics critical to First Calvary's transition to a new pastor in 2022. Members and attendees offered their opinion on 4 separate topics:

- 1. Pastoral Leadership
- 2. Effective Ministries
- 3. Christian Education
- 4. Congregational Growth



The information gathered was re-formatted and presented as action items during the Quarterly Church Conference on July 12, 2017. The following are the recommendations to be presented to the congregation for approval.

CONGREGATIONAL GROWTH RECOMMENDATIONS

Recommended that the Hospitality & Parking Ministries and New Members Class Leader create a plan to increase the spirit of excitement, love and fellowship from the parking lot to the pews. This includes but is not limited to:

- Position greeters at all entrances & parking lots
- Add way-finding signs to rear parking lots
- Acknowledge Sunday morning visitors before fellowship time
- Assign new members to Deacon family before completion of new members' class

 Recommend that the Hospitality Ministry create an outreach packet for FCBC members

EFFECTIVE MINISTRIES RECOMMENDATION

Recommend that the Visionary Ministry ensure each ministry has a mission statement, and if needed, consolidate ministries

CHRISTIAN EDUCATION RECOMMENDATION

Recommend the Christian Education ministry create a daytime bible study offering for retirees/sensational seniors

BRAINSTORMING ACTION ITEMS

- 1. Official Leadership Team: create a Pastoral Transition Plan
- 2. Hospitality and Parking Ministries & New members' Class leaders work together to create a plan to increase the spirit of excitement, love, and fellowship from the parking lot to the pews
- 3. Hospitality Ministry: create an Outreach packet to help FCBC members evangelize
- 4. Visionary Ministry: ensure that each ministry have a mission statement, and if needed, consolidate members


Each of these brainstorming items will be developed into action items to be articulated and actualized at the Leadership Conference in January 2018.

First Calvary Baptist Church held their Annual Spring Revival May 1-3, 2017, at 7:00pm nightly. Our guest Revivalist was Dr. H.B. Charles, Jr. Dr. Charles made a personal profession of faith and was baptized at the age of six. He began his public ministry at the age of eleven at the Mount Sinai Missionary Baptist Church in Los Angeles, California under the watchful eye of his father. His father's death

in 1989 left a personal and ministerial void in Dr. Charles' life. However, the Lord used this time to further his growth in grace and in the knowledge of the Lord. In 1990, at the age of seventeen, he was named to succeed his father. Dr. Charles is a growing and faithful student of Bible exposition. He is a preacher, an author, and a speaker who is frequently invited to speak at revivals, conferences and other church events on the local, state and national level.



On Monday evening, May 1st, Dr. Charles' topic was "God Will Give You Strength" with text taken from Isaiah 40:27-31. He said that God will give strength to those who remember to worship him, those who acknowledge their weaknesses and



those who are determined to wait on him. On Tuesday evening, May 2nd, Dr. Charles' topic was "The Great Invitation" with scripture from Isaiah 55. In this sermon, Dr. Charles said that "Our Holy God invites sinners to get right with him." 

RUNNING FOR OUR LIVES!

Vacation Bible School was held at First Calvary Baptist Church during the week of June 12-16, 2017. The theme for Vacation Bible School was "The Faith Run: On Course with God! The theme scripture was Hebrews 12:1. This scripture refers to a race so the Motto was Lace up! Classes were divided by age groups and groups studied age appropriate material from the theme topic.

In order to encourage families and those who work to attend Bible School, the Culinary Arts Ministry of the Church prepared a varied and delicious meal that was available each afternoon for a nominal fee. Bible School devotion began at 6:30pm with scripture, prayer, pledges and singing. After the devotion, students were dismissed from the sanctuary to the various classrooms to study the evening lesson.

The Adult Class Book contained an invitation for adults to pace themselves while staying on course with God. Back to School Vision Board

As we look forward to the start of a new school year, lots of advice swirled around my head until my thoughts settled on an activity that is often completed by adults at the start of a new calendar year: the creation of vision boards. Vision boards are used to make a visual representation of a person's goals in various areas of life, such as work, relationships, purchases, travel, and income. Most people use poster boards and cutouts

from magazines to represent their goals.

The vision boards are then placed in a location where they can be easily seen.

This helps the creator to concentrate on


their goals daily. There are many examples of how vision boards help people to reach both small and large goals.

So, my back-to-school challenge to students K - 20 is to create a vision board representing your goals for the coming school year using the same strategy that adults use: poster boards and magazine cutouts to represent your goals in the areas of grades, homework, projects, reading, sports, clubs and other extracurricular activities, relationships with peers and teachers, character, behavior, and any other areas that fit. Make it a family

affair. Parents can participate with their own vision boards and assist younger students with theirs. Don't have access to magazines and poster board? Draw pictures and print words to match your goals and tape them to your refrigerator or bathroom mirrors. The idea is to keep your goals in front of your eyes so they stay in front of your mind!

We invite you to submit pictures of your vision boards to the Calvary Chronicle. We will check back in January 2018 to find out how well your boards are working! Until then, we wish you Godspeed in your return to school!

HEALTHY LIVING

What is a HEALTHY LIFESTYLE?

A way of living that HELPS YOUR WHOLE FAMILY. When you adopt a healthy lifestyle you provide a more positive role model for others in your family, particularly children. You will also create a better environment for them to grow up in. Health is not just about avoiding a disease or illness. It is about spiritual, physical, mental and social wellbeing too. A large proportion of deaths, particular those from coronary heart and lung

cancer can be avoided. Scientific studies identified certain types of behavior (such as smoking) that contribute to serious illnesses and early deaths.

TOBACCO: Smoking is the greatest single self-imposed risk to health of all

RISK TO YOU: Respiratory Illness, coronary heart disease, and cancer

RISKS TO YOUR FAMILY: Respiratory illness, chest, nose, ear and throat infections. Your family's risks are increased two to three times if you smoke.

Babies who are exposed to tobacco smoke at home are at increased risk of sudden infant death. Young children who have one or more parents who smoke are twice as likely to suffer with chest problems in their first year of life (more than children whose parents do not smoke). They are also more likely to take up smoking themselves in later life

IF YOU ARE PREGNANT you can damage your baby's chance of being healthy by smoking even before the baby is born.

FACT: Tobacco-related diseases not only lead to many premature deaths but also to years of disease and disability. One half of all people who smoke regular will be killed by cigarettes. If you stop smoking before middle age you will avoid almost all the increased risk that would have otherwise occurred. Even stopping smoking in middle age can lower your risk.

If you don't use Tobacco DON'T START. If you do use Tobacco you can lower your risk by stopping NOW. The health benefits will start IMMEDIATELY.

WHAT YOU WILL ACHIEVE: Be LESS at risk from major illnesses, MORE MONEY to fulfill spiritual obligations, and to spend on better foods. You will FEEL MORE HEALTHY, and you will influence you Family's HEALTHY LIFESTYLE.


