FROM THE PASTOR'S DESK

As we move into our second month of "EMPOWERING DISCIPLES WITH GOD'S VISION", we recognize that it's that time of the year again, where this country pauses during the shortest month of the year, to celebrate the contributions and history of African Americans. I think about this month known as African American History Month and I think about what differences we HAVE made as a people to this society. From the shores of Africa to Jamestown, Virginia all the way down to St Helena Island, Georgia and even to James Island, SC (where my people come from...where do yours come from?). African Americans have made, and are still making, a difference. I encourage each of us to not allow all our ancestors have done for us be in vain. Don't become complacent, idol-minded, and culturally insensitive to the various needs of our communities. WHAT DIFFERENCE WILL WE MAKE TO INVOKE A CHANGE? There must be a renewal of that faith posture in this congregation today. We must gather together consistently to strive to become more effective as disciples of Jesus Christ.

My father would often say to me, "people may not like you or love you but you determine how they respect you!" As a people, we must revamp, realign and rearrange our priorities as a people of God first and as a people of Culture second. Not much is done these days around African American/Black History in our schools, not even in our churches (to my regret as Pastor, so can we get some volunteers?) but we can do something in our homes this month. Do something, talk about something, and read about something that will inspire you to make a DIFFERENCE in your community and world. HAVE YOU MADE A DIFFERENCE SO FAR THIS YEAR? If not, in the words of the original late night host, African American Arsenio Hall.... "Let's get busy!" Take a moment to quiz yourself....everyone, all ages....and do the African American inserts that will be in the bulletin this month. Share your results....let your "friends" and followers know YOU KNOW vour history!

During this month we offer many Ministry events where you can give of your TIME, TALENTS AND TREASURES. Next Sunday, we will celebrate Scholarship Sunday. Over the past few Sundays you have been informed about the purpose for which we raise these funds. Please consider making a contribution towards these efforts. THE DEACON'S MESSAGE

Then God said, "Let there be light," and there was light. And God saw that the light was good. Then He separated the light from the darkness. God called the light "day" and the darkness "night." And evening passed and the morning came, marking the first day. (Genesis 1:3-5) (NLT) The night is over. You made it through. The darkness of night has been pulled back like a curtain by the hands of God. All that remains is a new day to be explored. There may be memories of the night or the struggles of vesterday, but we should never attempt to carry anything heavier than hope into a new day. A new day is significant in the eyes of God. Even though the challenges of the day weary us into sleep of the night, a new day exposes us to new blessings and promises given to us by the hands of a loving God. Just as God spoke light into existence, he can speak deliverance, healing, hope and blessings into your life. God's separation of the night and day allows us to experience moments of darkness, which will always be followed by hours of light. 
