The concern was not about his qualifications or whether he likes working with children. The concern was ... well, it seemed to be about the fact that the son was *not* 'going into business'. His inevitable financial limitations would surely keep him from happiness and fulfillment.

My talk with that mother comes to mind now for several reasons - all bearing on young people and how their aspirations are shaped. I'm recalling, for instance, the four college-age and older souls who just gave four weeks to serve on the staff of Camp Chicago, our diocesan summer camp. Their commitments probably won't help any of them 'get ahead' in life. But their personal impact on the lives of some children and youth may be, well, eternal.

Or how about the dozen or more youth and adult advisors who'll leave for West Virginia this coming Saturday on St. Michael's annual senior high summer mission trip? Chances are that, for at least some of the youth, the experience will plant notions of future service commitments, maybe even a *calling* to serve?

Also, our guest preacher this Sunday, July 22, will be the Rev. Dr. Lora Walsh. She heads the 'Julian Year' project for the national Episcopal Service Corps (of which St. Michael's alumna the Rev. Amity Carrubba is Executive Director). The Julian Year is a ministry through which gifted young Episcopalians are welcomed to set aside a year to examine their gifts and to explore ways that they can 'invest' those gifts as people of faith.

You may think that it's too bad so many of our youth will be gone on Sunday. But Lora's most important audience, anyway, may be older adults: parents, grandparents, godparents, aunts, uncles, neighbors. We're the ones who give kids in our households and in our community daily messages about what it means to live not only a good life but also a meaningful and faithful life.





The concern was not about his qualifications or whether he likes working with children. The concern was ... well, it seemed to be about the fact that the son was *not* 'going into business'. His inevitable financial limitations would surely keep him from happiness and fulfillment.

My talk with that mother comes to mind now for several reasons - all bearing on young people and how their aspirations are shaped. I'm recalling, for instance, the four college-age and older souls who just gave four weeks to serve on the staff of Camp Chicago, our diocesan summer camp. Their commitments probably won't help any of them 'get ahead' in life. But their personal impact on the lives of some children and youth may be, well, eternal.

Or how about the dozen or more youth and adult advisors who'll leave for West Virginia this coming Saturday on St. Michael's annual senior high summer mission trip? Chances are that, for at least some of the youth, the experience will plant notions of future service commitments, maybe even a *calling* to serve?

Amity Carrubba is Executive Director). 



The concern was not about his qualifications or whether he likes working with children. The concern was ... well, it seemed to be about the fact that the son was *not* 'going into business'. His inevitable financial limitations would surely keep him from happiness and fulfillment.

My talk with that mother comes to mind now for several reasons - all bearing on young people and how their aspirations are shaped. I'm recalling, for instance, the four college-age and older souls who just gave four weeks to serve on the staff of Camp Chicago, our diocesan summer camp. Their commitments probably won't help any of them 'get ahead' in life. But their personal impact on the lives of some children and youth may be, well, eternal.

Or how about the dozen or more youth and adult advisors who'll leave for West Virginia this coming Saturday on St. Michael's annual senior high summer mission trip? Chances are that, for at least some of the youth, the experience will plant notions of future service commitments, maybe even a *calling* to serve?

Also, our guest preacher this Sunday, July 22, will be the Rev. Dr. Lora Walsh. She heads the 'Julian Year' project for the national Episcopal Service Corps (of which St. Michael's alumna the Rev. Amity Carrubba is Executive Director). You may think that it's too bad so many of our youth will be gone on Sunday. My talk with that mother comes to mind now for several reasons - all bearing on young people and how their aspirations are shaped. I'm recalling, for instance, the four college-age and older souls who just gave four weeks to serve on the staff of Camp Chicago, our diocesan summer camp. Their commitments probably won't help any of them 'get ahead' in life. But their personal impact on the lives of some children and youth may be, well, eternal.

Or how about the dozen or more youth and adult advisors who'll leave for West Virginia this coming Saturday on St. Michael's annual senior high summer mission trip? Chances are that, for at least some of the youth, the experience will plant notions of future service commitments, maybe even a *calling* to serve?

The concern was not about his qualifications or whether he likes working with children. The concern was ... well, it seemed to be about the fact that the son was *not* 'going into business'. His inevitable financial limitations would surely keep him from happiness and fulfillment.

My talk with that mother comes to mind now for several reasons - all bearing on young people and how their aspirations are shaped. I'm recalling, for instance, the four college-age and older souls who just gave four weeks to serve on the staff of Camp Chicago, our diocesan summer camp. Their commitments probably won't help any of them 'get ahead' in life. But their personal impact on the lives of some children and youth may be, well, eternal.

Or how about the dozen or more youth and adult advisors who'll leave for West Virginia this coming Saturday on St. Michael's annual senior high summer mission trip? Chances are that, for at least some of the youth, the experience will plant notions of future service commitments, maybe even a *calling* to serve?

Also, our guest preacher this Sunday, July 22, will be the Rev. Dr. Lora Walsh. She heads the 'Julian Year' project for the national Episcopal Service Corps (of which St. Michael's alumna the Rev. Amity Carrubba is Executive Director). You may think that it's too bad so many of our youth will be gone on Sunday. 



The concern was not about his qualifications or whether he likes working with children. The concern was ... well, it seemed to be about the fact that the son was *not* 'going into business'. His inevitable financial limitations would surely keep him from happiness and fulfillment.

My talk with that mother comes to mind now for several reasons - all bearing on young people and how their aspirations are shaped. I'm recalling, for instance, the four college-age and older souls who just gave four weeks to serve on the staff of Camp Chicago, our diocesan summer camp. Their commitments probably won't help any of them 'get ahead' in life. But their personal impact on the lives of some children and youth may be, well, eternal.

Or how about the dozen or more youth and adult advisors who'll leave for West Virginia this coming Saturday on St. Michael's annual senior high summer mission trip? Chances are that, for at least some of the youth, the experience will plant notions of future service commitments, maybe even a *calling* to serve?

Also, our guest preacher this Sunday, July 22, will be the Rev. Dr. Lora Walsh. She heads the 'Julian Year' project for the national Episcopal Service Corps (of which St. Michael's alumna the Rev. Amity Carrubba is Executive Director). The Julian Year is a ministry through which gifted young Episcopalians are welcomed to set aside a year to examine their gifts and to explore ways that they can 'invest' those gifts as people of faith.

You may think that it's too bad so many of our youth will be gone on Sunday. But Lora's most important audience, anyway, may be older adults: parents, grandparents, godparents, aunts, uncles, neighbors. We're the ones who give kids in our households and in our community daily messages about what it means to live not only a good life but also a meaningful and faithful life.

The concern was not about his qualifications or whether he likes working with children. The concern was ... well, it seemed to be about the fact that the son was *not* 'going into business'. His inevitable financial limitations would surely keep him from happiness and fulfillment.

My talk with that mother comes to mind now for several reasons - all bearing on young people and how their aspirations are shaped. I'm recalling, for instance, the four college-age and older souls who just gave four weeks to serve on the staff of Camp Chicago, our diocesan summer camp. Their commitments probably won't help any of them 'get ahead' in life. But their personal impact on the lives of some children and youth may be, well, eternal.

Or how about the dozen or more youth and adult advisors who'll leave for West Virginia this coming Saturday on St. Michael's annual senior high summer mission trip? Chances are that, for at least some of the youth, the experience will plant notions of future service commitments, maybe even a *calling* to serve?

Also, our guest preacher this Sunday, July 22, will be the Rev. Dr. Lora Walsh. She heads the 'Julian Year' project for the national Episcopal Service Corps (of which St. Michael's alumna the Rev. Amity Carrubba is Executive Director). 



The concern was not about his qualifications or whether he likes working with children. The concern was ... well, it seemed to be about the fact that the son was *not* 'going into business'. His inevitable financial limitations would surely keep him from happiness and fulfillment.

My talk with that mother comes to mind now for several reasons - all bearing on young people and how their aspirations are shaped. I'm recalling, for instance, the four college-age and older souls who just gave four weeks to serve on the staff of Camp Chicago, our diocesan summer camp. Their commitments probably won't help any of them 'get ahead' in life. But their personal impact on the lives of some children and youth may be, well, eternal.

Or how about the dozen or more youth and adult advisors who'll leave for West Virginia this coming Saturday on St. Michael's annual senior high summer mission trip? Chances are that, for at least some of the youth, the experience will plant notions of future service commitments, maybe even a *calling* to serve?

Also, our guest preacher this Sunday, July 22, will be the Rev. Dr. Lora Walsh. She heads the 'Julian Year' project for the national Episcopal Service Corps (of which St. Michael's alumna the Rev. Amity Carrubba is Executive Director). 



The concern was not about his qualifications or whether he likes working with children. The concern was ... well, it seemed to be about the fact that the son was *not* 'going into business'. His inevitable financial limitations would surely keep him from happiness and fulfillment.

My talk with that mother comes to mind now for several reasons - all bearing on young people and how their aspirations are shaped. I'm recalling, for instance, the four college-age and older souls who just gave four weeks to serve on the staff of Camp Chicago, our diocesan summer camp. Their commitments probably won't help any of them 'get ahead' in life. But their personal impact on the lives of some children and youth may be, well, eternal.

The concern was not about his qualifications or whether he likes working with children. The concern was ... well, it seemed to be about the fact that the son was *not* 'going into business'. His inevitable financial limitations would surely keep him from happiness and fulfillment.

The concern was not about his qualifications or whether he likes working with children. The concern was ... well, it seemed to be about the fact that the son was *not* 'going into business'. His inevitable financial limitations would surely keep him from happiness and fulfillment.

My talk with that mother comes to mind now for several reasons - all bearing on young people and how their aspirations are shaped. 



The concern was not about his qualifications or whether he likes working with children. The concern was ... well, it seemed to be about the fact that the son was *not* 'going into business'. His inevitable financial limitations would surely keep him from happiness and fulfillment.

Chances are that, for at least some of the youth, the experience will plant notions of future service commitments, maybe even a *calling* to serve?

My talk with that mother comes to mind now for several reasons - all bearing on young people and how their aspirations are shaped. 



The concern was not about his qualifications or whether he likes working with children. The concern was ... well, it seemed to be about the fact that the son was *not* 'going into business'. His inevitable financial limitations would surely keep him from happiness and fulfillment.

My talk with that mother comes to mind now for several reasons - all bearing on young people and how their aspirations are shaped. I'm recalling, for instance, the four college-age and older souls who just gave four weeks to serve on the staff of Camp Chicago, our diocesan summer camp. Their commitments probably won't help any of them 'get ahead' in life. But their personal impact on the lives of some children and youth may be, well, eternal.

Or how about the dozen or more youth and adult advisors who'll leave for West Virginia this coming Saturday on St. Michael's annual senior high summer mission trip? Chances are that, for at least some of the youth, the experience will plant notions of future service commitments, maybe even a *calling* to serve?

Also, our guest preacher this Sunday, July 22, will be the Rev. Dr. Lora Walsh. She heads the 'Julian Year' project for the national Episcopal Service Corps (of which St. Michael's alumna the Rev. Amity Carrubba is Executive Director). The Julian Year is a ministry through which gifted young Episcopalians are welcomed to set aside a year to examine their gifts and to explore ways that they can 'invest' those gifts as people of faith.

You may think that it's too bad so many of our youth will be gone on Sunday. But Lora's most important audience, anyway, may be older adults: parents, grandparents, godparents, aunts, uncles, neighbors. We're the ones who give kids in our households and in our community daily messages about what it means to live not only a good life but also a meaningful and faithful life.

The concern was not about his qualifications or whether he likes working with children. The concern was ... well, it seemed to be about the fact that the son was *not* 'going into business'. His inevitable financial limitations would surely keep him from happiness and fulfillment.

My talk with that mother comes to mind now for several reasons - all bearing on young people and how their aspirations are shaped. I'm recalling, for instance, the four college-age and older souls who just gave four weeks to serve on the staff of Camp Chicago, our diocesan summer camp. Their commitments probably won't help any of them 'get ahead' in life. But their personal impact on the lives of some children and youth may be, well, eternal.

Or how about the dozen or more youth and adult advisors who'll leave for West Virginia this coming Saturday on St. Michael's annual senior high summer mission trip? Chances are that, for at least some of the youth, the experience will plant notions of future service commitments, maybe even a *calling* to serve?

Also, our guest preacher this Sunday, July 22, will be the Rev. Dr. Lora Walsh. She heads the 'Julian Year' project for the national Episcopal Service Corps (of which St. Michael's alumna the Rev. Amity Carrubba is Executive Director). The Julian Year is a ministry through which gifted young Episcopalians are welcomed to set aside a year to examine their gifts and to explore ways that they can 'invest' those gifts as people of faith.

You may think that it's too bad so many of our youth will be gone on Sunday. But Lora's most important audience, anyway, may be older adults: parents, grandparents, godparents, aunts, uncles, neighbors. We're the ones who give kids in our households and in our community daily messages about what it means to live not only a good life but also a meaningful and faithful life.

The concern was not about his qualifications or whether he likes working with children. The concern was ... well, it seemed to be about the fact that the son was *not* 'going into business'. His inevitable financial limitations would surely keep him from happiness and fulfillment.

My talk with that mother comes to mind now for several reasons - all bearing on young people and how their aspirations are shaped. I'm recalling, for instance, the four college-age and older souls who just gave four weeks to serve on the staff of Camp Chicago, our diocesan summer camp. Their commitments probably won't help any of them 'get ahead' in life. But their personal impact on the lives of some children and youth may be, well, eternal.

Or how about the dozen or more youth and adult advisors who'll leave for West Virginia this coming Saturday on St. Michael's annual senior high summer mission trip? Chances are that, for at least some of the youth, the experience will plant notions of future service commitments, maybe even a *calling* to serve?

Also, our guest preacher this Sunday, July 22, will be the Rev. Dr. Lora Walsh. She heads the 'Julian Year' project for the national Episcopal Service Corps (of which St. Michael's alumna the Rev. Amity Carrubba is Executive Director). The Julian Year is a ministry through which gifted young Episcopalians are welcomed to set aside a year to examine their gifts and to explore ways that they can 'invest' those gifts as people of faith.

You may think that it's too bad so many of our youth will be gone on Sunday. But Lora's most important audience, anyway, may be older adults: parents, grandparents, godparents, aunts, uncles, neighbors. We're the ones who give kids in our households and in our community daily messages about what it means to live not only a good life but also a meaningful and faithful life.





The concern was not about his qualifications or whether he likes working with children. The concern was ... well, it seemed to be about the fact that the son was *not* 'going into business'. His inevitable financial limitations would surely keep him from happiness and fulfillment.

My talk with that mother comes to mind now for several reasons - all bearing on young people and how their aspirations are shaped. I'm recalling, for instance, the four college-age and older souls who just gave four weeks to serve on the staff of Camp Chicago, our diocesan summer camp. Their commitments probably won't help any of them 'get ahead' in life. But their personal impact on the lives of some children and youth may be, well, eternal.

Or how about the dozen or more youth and adult advisors who'll leave for West Virginia this coming Saturday on St. Michael's annual senior high summer mission trip? Chances are that, for at least some of the youth, the experience will plant notions of future service commitments, maybe even a *calling* to serve?

Also, our guest preacher this Sunday, July 22, will be the Rev. Dr. Lora Walsh. She heads the 'Julian Year' project for the national Episcopal Service Corps (of which St. Michael's alumna the Rev. Amity Carrubba is Executive Director). You may think that it's too bad so many of our youth will be gone on Sunday. My talk with that mother comes to mind now for several reasons - all bearing on young people and how their aspirations are shaped. I'm recalling, for instance, the four college-age and older souls who just gave four weeks to serve on the staff of Camp Chicago, our diocesan summer camp. Their commitments probably won't help any of them 'get ahead' in life. But their personal impact on the lives of some children and youth may be, well, eternal.

Or how about the dozen or more youth and adult advisors who'll leave for West Virginia this coming Saturday on St. Michael's annual senior high summer mission trip? Chances are that, for at least some of the youth, the experience will plant notions of future service commitments, maybe even a *calling* to serve?





The concern was not about his qualifications or whether he likes working with children. The concern was ... well, it seemed to be about the fact that the son was *not* 'going into business'. His inevitable financial limitations would surely keep him from happiness and fulfillment.

My talk with that mother comes to mind now for several reasons - all bearing on young people and how their aspirations are shaped. I'm recalling, for instance, the four college-age and older souls who just gave four weeks to serve on the staff of Camp Chicago, our diocesan summer camp. Their commitments probably won't help any of them 'get ahead' in life. But their personal impact on the lives of some children and youth may be, well, eternal.

Or how about the dozen or more youth and adult advisors who'll leave for West Virginia this coming Saturday on St. Michael's annual senior high summer mission trip? Chances are that, for at least some of the youth, the experience will plant notions of future service commitments, maybe even a *calling* to serve?

Also, our guest preacher this Sunday, July 22, will be the Rev. Dr. Lora Walsh. She heads the 'Julian Year' project for the national Episcopal Service Corps (of which St. Michael's alumna the Rev. Amity Carrubba is Executive Director). The Julian Year is a ministry through which gifted young Episcopalians are welcomed to set aside a year to examine their gifts and to explore ways that they can 'invest' those gifts as people of faith.

You may think that it's too bad so many of our youth will be gone on Sunday. But Lora's most important audience, anyway, may be older adults: parents, grandparents, godparents, aunts, uncles, neighbors. We're the ones who give kids in our households and in our community daily messages about what it means to live not only a good life but also a meaningful and faithful life.
