• Today, Thursday: The cacophony outside my office window is the preschool playground. Toddlers laugh, squeal, whoop, seek attention, compete for toys, and more.

In just these few images are souls in every stage of life. And this Sword will include news or invitations that will also invite, inform or appeal to people in every stage of life. You'll find a report on our newly formed **Family Advisory Board** (not to be confused with our separate **Youth Advisory**) **Board**). There's an invitation to the upcoming **50 Something**! This letter is devoted to considering all the generations represented in the life and ministry of St. Michael's. The view may not initially seem profound. But sociologists, realtors and ad executives (among others) know that we in our culture are increasingly segmented by age and isolated from those of other ages in our relationships, activities and lifestyles.

In instances like St. Michael's, the local church remains a striking exception. It's one place where souls of all ages take part, have roles, are valued, form relationships, seek God. In the best scenario, we're not just sharing the building. Stories shared across generations expand our curiosity and perspectives. The young are inspired by the elders. The elders are energized by the young.

Our cultural conditioning may cause us to mainly see and associate with others at church of our own generation. I hope, though, that we'll all take note of those who are older and/or younger than ourselves. And not only take note. Consider the opportunities for and value of intergenerational relationships, worship, learning and service that the church uniquely provides.

# Parish Potluck and New Ministry, Family Advisory Board

One of the newest ministries at St. Michael's is the Family Advisory Board commissioned in September 2012. I have been asked just what this board is and what the purpose and role of the board will

be. Those are truly interesting questions that will have to await specific answers until we are a bit further down the road of this program year; but, perhaps, sharing how the board came to be may reveal more about its vision and purpose. The Youth Minister has a Parent Advisory Board, but Children's Ministries has not boasted such a board in the past. When Peggy Blass, the Assistant Children's Ministries Director retired in the spring, the checks to my balance were suddenly missing. This was not healthy place for any ministry. Why not take the opportunity to adopt a system like the Youth Advisory Board? In discussing this with clergy, we decided to broaden the scope of the board from "Children's Ministries" to "Family". And then the question became what constitutes a "family"? We decided that a family at St. Michael's is really the family of St. Michael's composed of the many families of any size, from one to many. We established a preliminary set of suggested focus areas, but those are subject to change as we determine what issues really shape the board. Some of the suggested focus areas include:

- To encourage families in their religious and spiritual lives in practical ways at home, at St. Michael's and in our local communities.
- To help refine the vision of the particular ways in which families may participate more fully in scripture, liturgy/worship and fellowship at St. Michael's.

Our Kick-off Event is the Parish Potluck on Sunday, 28 October at 5:00 p.m. detailed below. Our vision is to host these potluck dinners on the last Sunday of the month, January through October.

Currently on the board are Mary Mathison, Renee Blue, Sof Cesario, Sue Beverly, George and Jennifer Tarulis, Nerissa Brueckbauer and Julia Bishop, in an advisory role, as well as, the Reverends Caruso and Raymond. 
## Be an Altar Bread Angel!
