No matter how well put-together we may be, all of us face many questions which present themselves when we least expect them. Just a few of those questions might be: "Does anybody understand?" "Does God care?" "Can I find Him in my brokenness?"

On 16 September the "Food For the Journey" offering, "How Do We Respond When the Unthinkable Happens? What Role Does Our Faith Play?" helped explore some of these questions within ourselves and in our life as a community. You may remember John Yerger facilitated this discussion and gave not only his own unique perspective on "the unthinkable," but also inspired those in attendance to reflect on these issues in our own lives.

("Unthinkable" may seem synonymous with "impossible," but this session brought into focus the truth that these kinds of situations happen to all of us. The Scriptures tell us over and over that trouble and pain are part of life, and it just isn't optional. Jesus, especially, tells us we are never alone, and His Spirit works in and through our pain. We are commended to love, unity, and the fellowship of "one another.")

This gathering was well-attended and highly interactive, which made me wonder if our often-muted desires for deeper relationships are being awakened here at St. Michael's. Those who have experienced this kind of encouragement and comfort through the ministry of Christ expressed in a brother or sister know how precious it is.

A fond hope of mine is that St. Michael's increasingly becomes a sanctuary of hope and healing. The world "out there" may not always be a safe place to ask our deepest questions, especially when we are hurting. We can, however, begin to cultivate a culture of trust and concern, where burdens can be shared and borne together. We can sometimes drop the story of "I'm doing great! How are you?" We do that so we can tell the true story, and let another person gift us with a listening, supportive presence. We have so much to offer each other, and one of these gifts is the sense of not being alone in our guestions or our suffering. We have only begun to draw from a deep well in ourselves and in our life together as Christ's new community. This would not only enrich and invigorate us as a church family, but also empower our lives and ministry in the world we live in. Now more than ever, our light is needed in this darkening scene.

### **Outreach Fall Granting Allocations Report**

The Outreach Grant Allocations Committee is excited to report that St. Michael's has made the difference in 27 organizations and ministries in the greater Chicago area! At their October meeting, the Vestry approved \$44,681 in grants - bringing the total for 2012 to \$108,881! This year, we are funding organizations like Lawrence Hall and St. Cyprian's Food Panty, that have been supported by St. Michael's for many years. Thanks to input from parishioners, we are supporting a couple of new organizations. Feeding Greater Elgin is a new food panty in Elgin started by local community members who saw a need and are working hard to provide food to over 800 families a month! Our 2012 donation of \$4000 will help them purchase food from the Greater Chicago Area Food Depository. St. Michael's Children's Ministries have visited Lydia Home several times over the past few years. Their \$3000 grant will be used to offset tuition costs for low-income students at Urban Academy. Urban Academy is Lydia Home's non-traditional high school for students that have dropped or failed out of the Chicago Public School system.
