This wonderful outreach event could not happen without the generosity of our volunteers and donors - the heart of the event. Tony Stallone, vice president of Peapod, donates the majority of the food including the turkeys. The

kitchen crew begins at 8:00 a.m.; volunteers deliver cooked turkeys and pies; table setters and waiters are on hand throughout the morning. Barrington School Bus Company donates a bus and driver to pick up the recruits. Our very own Joe Ridges has been in the driver's seat for the last two years. Our senior high youth serve as volunteer drivers and deliver dozens of meals to three police/fire stations and the elderly who feel more comfortable eating at home. Rick Taylor, electrician extraordinaire, sets up a multi laptop station (cellphones also on hand for the day) where the recruits can connect with home and the all-important Facebook. Premium Blend, a girls' a cappella group from Barrington High School, has performed each year for our guests. Generous monetary donations have been received this year to help defray any remaining costs. There is hardly a thank you big enough for all these awesome people! THANK YOU!

The event concludes around 5 p.m. when the last recruit is on the bus on the way back to the base. We share with you with a note emailed to St. Michael's last year from the mother of one of our guests. Her words capture it all.....

Thank you so much for having our 50 recruits from Great Lakes. My son was one of them and he had a great time. After being in boot camp for almost 60 days, it felt like they were literally in Heaven because of you. You not only had an impact on 50 future sailors of America but you also have given unspeakable JOY to their families...I just want to SHOUT OUT LOUD. I am so thankful that you gave my son a wonderful Thanksgiving Day. When I asked him where he was and when he told me St. Michael's, I told him," Michael, that is where you are supposed to be today!" I love each and every one of you for making this happen. God Bless you thru this Holiday Season.
