a letter to the people of St. Michael's from the Rector

The angel said to the shepherds, "Do not be afraid; for see-I am bringing you good news of great joy for all the people ..." - Luke 2:10

Dear people of St. Michael's,

Starting at 2 pm on Christmas Eve, I heard the Nativity story FIVE TIMES in less than twenty-four hours. But it wasn't until the fifth and last time, during the Eucharist on Christmas Day, that I heard the word *joy*. Heard it with my heart, that is.

When I say I heard it with my heart, I don't mean I understood it. In fact, hearing it with the heart brought up all sorts of questions, none of which I satisfactorily answered, but some of which were:

Where is the joy in *my* life? What exactly *is* joy? And how does it differ from our cultural definition of happiness? Why (I wondered most of all) did the angel speak of joy



Volunteer Chaplain Training at Bishop Anderson House BENEFITING CONGREGATIONS AND

INDIVIDUALS

As the new year begins have you made a resolution to take the time to just "be" with others? Perhaps the Bishop Anderson House Volunteer Chaplain Training program is for you. The 13-week class equips students with the pastoral skills to establish a ministry of presence with anyone in distress, and tools for processing encounters in ways that lead to self-discovery and growth.

Class topics include the theological purpose of pastoral care; active listening; non-combative communication; faith, sacrament and prayer; older adults and home bound; loss and death; ethics, boundaries and self care.

Graduates are able to expand the pastoral care ministry in the congregation and taught the techniques for building or starting caring ministries in nursing homes or hospitals. Applications for the spring term are being accepted now; contact Cherryl Holt, Associate for Chaplaincy at 312.563.4823.
