Absolute Help

a letter to the people from the Rector

Dear People of St. Michael's,

What does it feel like to regularly fail in our desire and efforts to help other people? A pastor and author by the name of Richard Rohr sees the dilemma this way: "Much of our helping is like hoping for first-class accommodations on the Titanic. It feels good at the moment, but ... the big tear in the hull is not addressed, and we are surprised when people drown, complain or resort to lifeboats."

One might think that despair or cynicism would result from such a view. For Rohr it has apparently led to deeper humility and a wiser perspective. He notes a critical difference between help and HELP: "... to essentially help another person ... is absolutely unlike any other form of helping. It has

many counterfeits and disguises. What Jesus, Buddha, Confucius, the saints and prophets are talking about is Absolute Help, which alone is worthy of the name - the radical help that none of us can give to another. We can only point to it and promise that it is there. That is the first and final work of all true religion; all else is secondary."

I'm not surprised that this muse of Richard Rohr's jumped

I'm not surprised that this muse of Richard Rohr's jumped off the page at me when I read it yesterday. The parish clergy, staff, Vestry members and other lay leaders are all helping in high gear now. We're preparing for Holy Week and Easter, launching Faith Reflection Groups, readying for the Vestry's annual planning retreat (March 2). These and so many other activities at St. Michael's are devoted to orchestrating resources in order to *help* all who worship and serve at and through St. Michael's and in order to help many beyond our walls.

In the context of all this, Rohr's words caution me. I want to believe that we at St. Michael's are not just frantically generating more and more of the 'counterfeits and disguises' of which he writes. And I pause in this holy season of Lent to pray for an ever deeper awareness of our common, essential need for Absolute Help. May all of us at St. Michael's discover more ways - for one another and for the world - to authentically 'point to it and promise that it is there.'



Little Red Wagon in February and March

About 20 years ago our church started collecting food for St. Cyuprian Food Pantry during Lent. It was an Episcopal mission on the northweat side of Chicago when in 1983 someone knocked on the door to ask for food. That simple begining of the food pantry has now mushroomed into one serving 855 families (3,825 individuals) in December alone and with a budget of \$56,000 a year. Over time, St. Michael's has included more food pantries in our donation rotation, but in Lent we are reminded of our beginnings with St. Cyprian Food Pantry. The needs include breakfast. lunch and dinner foods, detergent, personal items and paper products. May donations to




Reaffirming your faith: An Opportunity to renew your commitment to a life of Faith...
