

discouraged by the physical condition of the church and by our overall strategy for building cleaning and maintenance. Recently, with the help and support of the parish staff and others, we've made the following changes:

• We recently hired **Lolita Graham** and **Maria Koerner** to do the nightly cleaning of the preschool (as required by DCFS regulation). By focusing these new staff members' responsibilities solely on the preschool, we'll better understand the actual cost for this feature of preschool operations. Lolita and Maria are reporting directly to Caren and the preschool teachers are now reporting: *"It's never been this clean! We could eat off the floor!"*

 Ed Allen began employment and service this week as our new parish sexton (a word we Episcopalians most often use to identify the church janitor and handyman). As we presently envision this half-time role, Ed will be responsible both for the routine building cleaning and also many of the repairs and improvements required in any public building. Ed has retired from other full-time work, and we look forward to benefiting from his extensive related work experience. For starters, Ed will be at St. Michael's each weekday from 9 am -1 pm.

 These new staff members represent, of course, both our hope for a better overall environment at St. Michael's but also the end of existing relationships. Most of us probably did not know the names of those who've been cleaning the church on a contract basis with a cleaning service for the past few years. Our now-former sexton, Jeff Schirmer, for whom this was a second job, also worked mostly at night or in the early morning and was unknown to most parishioners. But Jeff also has longtime ties to St. Michael's. Those who may wish to thank him for his efforts and goodwill are welcomed to make direct personal contact with him.

 There are likely to be some snafus and misunderstandings and adjustments as we try to put new systems in place. I'll be grateful for your observations, feedback and suggestions - and your patience. For now, we will no longer be able to count on the nightly lock-up by a cleaning service. I ask that those who depart from evening meetings assume this responsibility. Also, a few more meetings may be self-serve in terms of setting up tables and chairs (and putting them away). Despite some inconveniences, we are mainly anticipating positive impacts from these changes: a church that is cleaner and better maintained and also, we hope, at least a small savings in our operating budget.

Holy Week and Easter Worship Notes

 Attention all actual and potential worship ministers! Holy Week is a time when we often need extra EVERYTHING: ushers, readers, singers, acolytes and more. This year, Holy Week also corresponds to Spring Break for Barrington School District 220. We're likely to be short-staffed in terms of worship ministries.  No Maundy Thursday Meal this year ... Two years ago we had 90 participants and last year only about 25. We decided to give it a rest for 2013. If you have questions, or suggestions for future years ... ask the Rector ...

About 20 years ago our church started collecting food for St. Cyuprian Food Pantry during Lent. It was an **Episcopal** mission on the northweat side of Chicago when in 1983 someone knocked on the door to ask for food. That simple begining of the food pantry has now mushroomed into one serving 855 families (3,825 individuals) in December alone and with a budget of \$56,000 a year. 



Nicholas Alvin Johnson Memorial Scholarship Application Call

2013 marks the eighth year of the Nicholas Alvin Johnson Memorial Scholarship which is awarded to a high school graduate for the purpose of college or university fees to a four year institution.
