

a pastoral letter to the people of St. Michael's by the Rector

Dear People of St. Michael's,

OpenYou may have noted that trees have been a main theme+From Our Youth
Ministerhere over the past year. A ministry flyer that we mailed last fall
(and again as winter approached) included an image of a
thriving tree and the invitation: Come and grow. In the New
Year we introduced the notion of Roots & Branches. Out of it
grew our energizing Faith Reflection Groups, in which over
100 parishioners have taken part.

A natural development of the tree theme now is: *Branching Out!*

A number of both recent and upcoming gatherings have all been designed, you might say, to evaluate, appreciate, trim and nurture the tree that is our common life, faith and mission. Each gathering has examined or will examine one or more 'branches' of our ministries. +The Vestry's 3rd annual leadership gathering, Saturday, May 4, provided views from and asked for responses to six separate ministries.

+ At a Super Supper Summit last night, May 15, 30 parishioners shared in evaluating all ministries related to adult spiritual growth and fellowship - as we start to plan for the coming (school/church) year.

+ *New Growth in Family Ministries* - this coming Sunday, May 19 - will be a featured presentation this Sunday, the Feast of Pentecost. (See more information elsewhere.)

+ Outreach Mission Crossroads, Sunday, June 9, after both services. Come hear dreams and share questions related to the future of outreach at St. Michael's.

+ Faces of Care, Sunday, June 16, after both services. The stories of some parishioners may cause you to smile and re-think the meaning of 'pastoral care', who does it, and how. In the case of tree care and growth, one should look at every feature of the tree but only touch or change what will lead to the tree's overall best health. That's how I trust we'll proceed at St. Michael's with the growth of our mission and ministries.

And your part? Well, most parishioners are unlikely to take in every gathering I described above. But I hope, pray and ask you to pick a branch or two and join me and others there.


Part I:Bible Interpretation and Church Teachings Part II:Biological and Social Research, Other Churches and Current Legal Status

Diocesan Convention to Reconvene June 8 meeting will consider reunification with Quincy

The 175th Convention of the Diocese of Chicago will reconvene on June 8 at St. James Cathedral for the purpose of considering the proposed reunification with the Episcopal Diocese of Quincy.

In November 2012, the 175th Convention unanimously passed Resolution A-175 affirming the Diocese of Chicago's intent to pursue reunification with Quincy and directing the bishop, with the advice and consent of the Standing Committee, to seek approval of the Quincy Reunion Agreement. At its conclusion, the convention was recessed rather than adjourned so that it could be called back into session to consider a final reunification agreement.

In May, members of the diocese are invited to attend one of four information sessions to learn more about the proposed reunification of the two dioceses, which were split to accommodate growth in 1877. Since 2008, the Episcopal Diocese of Quincy, based in Peoria, has been forging a new identity and mission after its bishop and about 60% of its members broke away to become founders of the conservative Anglican Church of North America.

the Barrington Area CROP Hunger Walk 2013!

Barrington Area CROP Hunger Walk is Sunday, October 20, and there's still plenty of time to be a part of it! The next meeting will be June 13 at 7:30 p.m. The Recruiter's Rally, an important meeting for each church representative to attend, will be Sat., Sept. 7 at 8:30 a.m. at Barrington United Methodist Church. Materials and suggestions for recruiting walkers will be shared at this meeting.

This will be the 31st annual CROP Hunger Walk in Barrington. Over the past 30 years, almost 12,000 individuals have participated, raising almost \$1.3 million dollars; 25% of that total has stayed in the local community. Materials and suggestions for walkers will be made available, **so minimal work is involved from the recruiters (volunteers) at the church**. The church recruiter can attend both the June and September meeting or just the September meeting. Turnout of walkers varies at each church--there can be as few as five or over a hundred walkers. It's the spirit and the desire to make a difference in the lives of people who are hungry that matters!
