Minnesota or Bust: SMUSH Mission Trip 2013! a letter to the people of St. Michael's by Kara Joy Baker, Youth Minister and Children's Choir Director

Dear St. Michael's,

On June 8th, a week from Saturday, 10 youth and 6 adults from St. Michael's will be joined by 11 youth and 2 adults from Church of the Redeemer in Elgin to with one goal in mind. We will be traveling 575 miles north to serve the people of Onigum, MN, acting as the hands and feet of Christ in the world. Two churches unified to make a difference, build a community, and outwardly show God's love.

We will be working at St. John's Episcopal Church in Onigum as well as St. Peter's Episcopal Church in Cass Lake. Our list of tasks is big, but we are high in spirits and eager to serve.

The theme of cultural exchange is central to our mission trip. The participants will have an opportunity to worship with the people of St. John's, have a discussion the elders of Onigum, build relationships, and learn about the traditions and culture of the Leech Lake Band of Ojibwe.

Three improvement projects, described below, have been recently completed or are now underway at St. Michael's. As is true in the case of each of these projects, these are the kinds of improvements are often made possible through special, designated gifts made by one or more parishioners. Thank you to those who saw the needs and responded! And to those who see other needs and may be able to similarly help, please speak with the rector, wardens or B&G chairman Todd Ross about some present opportunities.



Project #1: Replacement of the original bell 'clapper' on the high 'e' note bell in our tower carillon. Instead of going 'ping, ping, ping ... **thud**' as Thom Wibbels plays the carillon, they now go 'ping, ping, ping ... **ping**!' (The adjacent photo shows our bell tower in 1954 -- before St. Michael's had ANY bells at all!) Special thanks to those who made special gifts!

Project #2: New kitchen appliances in the rectory and replacement of the main electrical service panel. The former range dated from the 70s and one of the burners had stopped working long ago. When we tried to add a circuit for a new over-the-range microwave/vent, we discovered numerous hazardous wiring configurations in a panel that is known in the industry to be problematic. All is now well! *Special thanks to those who made special gifts!*

Project #3: A Wall-Mounted Portable Defibrillator will be installed at St. Michael's, and individuals trained to use it, in the coming months. The units are commonly being installed in public spaces such as churches, libraries and schools, because use of them is known

+at the Blessing of the Children **Children** stand in front, hear about the day's lesson and receive a blessing.

+during the Song of Praise **Children** leave for Children's Chapel.

+during the Liturgy of the Word

- Scripture readings
- Sermon
- Creed
- Prayers of the People

Children are in Children's Chapel (located by the Children's Altar in the Church School Hallway)

+during The Peace/Offertory

Children return to Church-either during the exchanging of The Peace or after the offertory music has concluded-and remain in the church through the end of worship.
