Pastor's Corner

Dear Friends,

For the last several months, I have felt that God was saying to me that my time at Northminster is drawing to a close. I have always found this process personally difficult because vou always second guess yourself and you want to make sure what you are thinking is of God and not just you. After a long while. I have become convinced that this sense of call is real and our time together is ending. At the same time, I have also felt a strong desire to make sure things keep going in a positive direction for Northminster and minimize the disruption which leaving might cause. Not long ago, I spoke with Graham Hart, the General Presbyter of Peace River Presbytery, about my thoughts. He told me the Presbytery is working on a plan which would give a church several options, one of which can be that a current Pastor can remain while a church goes through the process of looking for a new Pastor. The Presbytery's new plan seeks to keep disruption at a minimum and help the church go through the transition, from one Pastor to another, as smoothly as possible.

At the last Session meeting, I announced that I believe God is calling me to do something different in ministry in the not too distant future, perhaps semi-retirement or an interim ministry. I also presented this new plan from the Presbytery, and it was agreed that we would explore it as a real option, as soon as possible.

I don't know where God is leading Cyndi and me, but I believe he will make it clear within the next one to two years. This long view is important to me because I want to do what it takes to help Northminster make a successful transition. If that means staying while the church looks for a new Pastor, I am willing to do that, if the church so chooses and the Presbytery approves.

What happens next? Very soon, your Session will begin working with the Presbytery to get organized and plan next steps. Please understand that this is not a top-down process. It is the congregation's responsibility to choose its leaders and the Session will make sure you are kept informed and involved.

CAN YOU HEAR ME NOW?Audio Upgrades for the Sanctuary

We have a major challenge with our Audio Visual System at Northminster. Most of our system dates back to 2006 and was moved over from the old Sanctuary. Its components are beginning to fail one by one, and we believe its days are numbered. For example, last fall we had failures three weeks in a row. Two things were eventually patched up, but one (a microphone system) simply had to be thrown out. These failures have been part of an increasing ongoing pattern for the last few years.

A total system upgrade is recommended, which is designed for this new sanctuary to support all activities conducted in it. Replacing things piecemeal, that is combining new equipment with our old equipment, is not an option and will make a bad situation much worse. Ten-year -old analog equipment is simply not compatible with the new HD equipment.

The cost of the proposed upgrade is estimated to be \$12,000. This may seem like a lot, but not in the scheme of things. Electronics are like automobiles these days in terms of cost. Like an automobile, \$12,000 is very modest compared to what it could be, and that amount will enable us to meet our needs for another ten years or more.

What will \$12,000 buy? Microphones, a new computer, interface systems to amplify sounds, new recording capabilities and the projection systems which display graphics

in support of the worship service, to name just a few things. We have sources from which we will get things at a reduced cost. The objective is to have the completed system easy to operate and will include installation, testing, and training.

The goal of this effort is to honor God by insuring the excellence of the worship experience of all who attend Northminster. That goal also includes the very practical goal of helping our congregation hear the worship service better.

Members are asked to give special consideration to support this effort financially. You may do this by making checks to Northminster Presbyterian Church with memo marked AV SYSTEM. We hope to raise the necessary funds over the next few months with a completion date in the fall.

FINANCIAL UPDATES

CAPITAL CAMPAIGN: YEAR ONE

Early last year, we started a Capital Campaign to pay down the NPC mortgage. At that time the mortgage was \$1.104,000.

During the campaign, you pledged over \$850,000 to accomplish that goal and, during the first year, you have provided a marvelous outpouring of funds. Thanks to a number of very generous one-time gifts and a significant amount of money being received weekly, monthly, and yearly, we have made a major reduction in the outstanding mortgage principal. By the time you read this, the **mortgage will be less than \$570,000.**

This is a wonderful accomplishment and, with the continuation of your pledges over the remaining three years, we will be in a position to handle our mortgage within our operating budget for the future.
