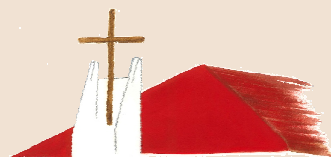

Dear Friends,

Do not be frightened. But in your hearts revere Christ as Lord. Always be prepared to give an answer to everyone who asks you to give the reason for the hope that you have. But do this with gentleness and respect... Peter 3:14c-15

Most Christians find the idea of evangelism intimidating. Because of that, most of us don't do it, and leave it up to the experts (like Pastors). The problem with this is two-fold. First and foremost, the command to evangelize is just that: a command. It is not a suggestion. Second, the experts can't be everywhere and, therefore, the task of evangelism must be for all Christians as they lead their lives and talk with people in many places.

I believe Peter's teaching gives us the following four steps in sharing our faith:

1. Don't feel the need to debate (*But do this with gentleness and respect...*). There is a place for gracious debate and/or conversation, but the good news is you do not have to.

2. Understand where most people are coming from. (*Do not be frightened.*) Most people, whether they are

religious or not, have a kind of self-help theology. If they do the right things, they can find or be right with God. For the religious, it is following particular teachings (Buddha, Watch Tower, etc.) or doing certain things (being in the right place, praying the right way, etc.). For the non-religious, it is trying as hard as you can to do good things (however defined) and hoping that you will be alright.

3. Understand and be able to communicate the Gospel. (*Always be prepared to give an answer to everyone who asks you to give the reason for the hope that you have.*)

Salvation is trusting what God has done for us, not in what we have done or will do. Christians certainly believe we should do the best we can and in doing the right things, but, because we are always imperfect, at heart we believe in God's grace. What this means is being able to tell people, in a few words, what Jesus has done for you.

4. Trust God for the results. (*But in your hearts revere Christ as Lord.*)

Pastor's Corner-continued

Let me share something that happened to me this past Sunday, which I hope will help illustrate. On Sunday before the service, a young woman came into the Narthex who wanted to speak with me. After introductions, she asked if I believed that Jesus was coming back soon. I answered that I most certainly did. She then talked about the need to get ready and make sure we are holy and right to be able to meet him when he comes.

1. I had just a few minutes. I could not debate with her, even if I wanted to. There is a place for debate but often the best thing is to simply state what you believe. So, that is what I tried to do.
2. At this point, I admit I engaged in a bit of religious profiling. I was fairly certain this woman was a Jehovah's Witness. Her message,

"Jesus is coming back very soon. You better get ready. Join us and you will be saved," suggested strongly that that was what she was. I admit that, because of my experience, I was able to come to this conclusion. *But it did not really matter.* All you have to remember is that anyone you are talking to probably believes you have to perform something to find God or salvation. In their case, they believe that you have to be one of them and follow the teachings of the Watch Tower.

Christians certainly believe we should do the best we can and in doing the right things, but again, because we are imperfect, at heart we believe in God's grace. Salvation is trusting what God has done for us, not in what we have done or will do. Our message is similar but very different: "Jesus is coming back. You better get

ready. Trust in him to find God and salvation. Then, join us as we serve him." So, I told her that if Jesus came back now, I would trust in what he did for me on the cross. I knew I could never be holy enough, but Jesus was and because of him I would be ok.

4. I then asked her if she would like to stay for the service and she politely said no. In her mind, I think, I was a lost cause. But I left the results to God.

One of the reasons God has put us on one earth is to share his Good News, and it is really good news. When people trust in themselves to find God, they will most certainly fail. Our message is that God finds us. What a difference that makes.

ROMANS WITH PASTOR CHRIS

BUILDING A CONTAGIOUS CHURCH

On the Road to Finding a New Pastor: Transition Preparedness Team Update

We now have two main groups that are involved in the work of finding a new pastor for Northminster.

First, the **Transition Preparedness Team (TPT)**, led by Bob Price and Tom Latimer, will continue to work with the membership to prepare all of us for the coming change of Pastor. We want to know what questions you, the members of the church, have about the work we are doing. We hope, in turn, to do a better job of communicating with you and involving you as we prepare for the day we welcome our new pastor.

The next “visible” thing we are going to do is place a “question” card in the Sunday morning bulletin, so you can ask the committee questions about our “journey”.

Second, we now have a **Pastor Nominating Committee (PNC)**, led by Dick Murphy. The PNC is responsible for finding and presenting a pastor candidate to the membership. The proposed new pastor must then be approved by the membership. The PNC will communicate to the membership periodically, as appropriate.

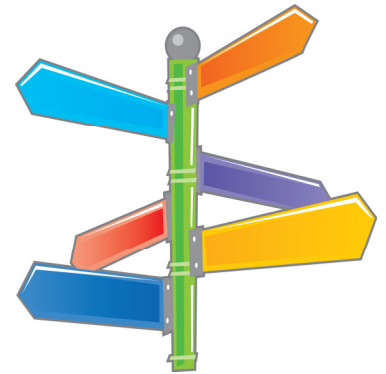
In July, our proposal to the Presbytery to use the Adaptive Approach was approved. We have made great progress in the last two months.

If we had used the standard Presbytery process, as we did for finding our earlier pastors, there would be an interim pastor, who would be our pastor and also work on the same type of work that the TPT has been, and will be, doing. Then, when all that work is completed, in about a year, a Pastor Nominating Committee would be formed to begin looking for a new pastor. This time, we are doing these processes in parallel; saving time by having two groups working on different areas.

We can do this because Pastor Chris continues to focus on being a great pastor. Without his willingness to stay at Northminster, we would not be able to use the Adaptive Approach for finding a new pastor.

Thank you again for your involvement, your questions, and your support.

Resurrection House



Founded by six local churches, Resurrection House is now supported by more than 30 religious entities.

Resurrection House is a forward thinking, faith-based resource center committed to transitioning at-risk individuals to a path of self-sufficiency. A 501(c)(3) non-profit, faith-based organization, it serves as a day resource center to the homeless of Sarasota County, Florida. Their services include showers, restrooms, laundry, counseling, medical treatment, food, clothing, veteran's assistance, post office, phone, and more

Since it was founded in 1989, Resurrection House has seen over 30,000 individual clients.

Resurrection House, is the designated recipient for our Local Mission gifts for the last quarter of 2016. To make your donation, please check the Local Mission box on your offering envelope or use the special Mission Envelope in your Sunday Bulletin.

In addition to this quarterly mission offering, Northminster collects "hotel size" toiletries to donate to this mission. These can be left in the bin outside the church offices or, on Sundays, in the Narthex.

The Presbyterian Church in Kirkuk, Iraq



Tens of thousands of Christians fled – by car, by bus, on foot – seeking shelter wherever they could find it.

Presbyterian Church in Kirkuk is about 100 miles from Mosul in a stable Kurdish-controlled area. The church has always been involved in a vibrant ministry to the people in the area, but in 2014 everything changed. In the streets around town, entire families stood dazed and bewildered, clutching small parcels of their personal belongings.

ISIS had taken Mosul and had pressed on into the nearby Nineveh Plain. Ahead of them fled tens of thousands of Christians – by car, by bus, on foot – seeking shelter wherever they could find it. More than 70 of them ended up living in the Presbyterian Church in Kirkuk, where every classroom and office became a small apartment. They are all still there and, with the help of other Christians all over the world, the church continues to help them, as best they can.

Although the tragic events in Iraq from the summer of 2014 have mostly faded from our daily news cycles, the past is very much present for Rev. Haitham Jazrawi and his congregation at the Presbyterian Church in Kirkuk.

What can we do to help? Though we cannot be there in person, our gifts go a long way to help this church and, through them, the people to whom they minister. It is on the front lines of God's work in that area and is doing magnificent work there responding to the needs of Christians and Muslims who fled their homes when ISIS invaded.

In addition to supporting refugees, the church runs a full-time school, which is attended by Christian and Muslim children, and is a great witness for Christ to the Muslims in the whole area.

All Faiths Food Bank

All Faiths Food Bank is the hub of hunger relief in Sarasota and DeSoto Counties. They pick up donated food, sort it, fill partner agency orders, deliver to 184 agencies and programs that distribute the food, and host mobile pantries that give food directly to clients in need. AFFB provides food for 51,000 residents every year; families with children, the elderly, the unemployed, and the low-income earners.

Please remember to bring donations of canned or boxed food staples and place them in the yellow barrel in the Narthex. *Please do not donate anything in glass containers.*

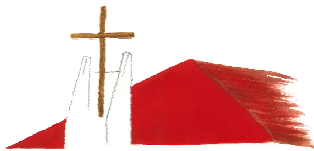
