Dear Friends,

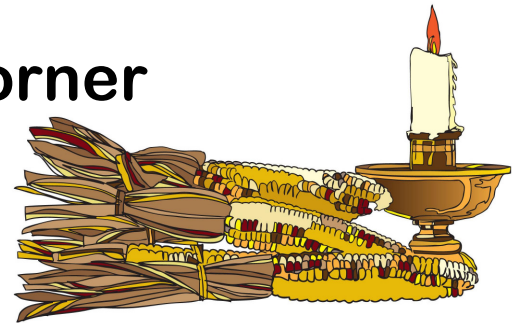
*Enter his gates with thanksgiving;
go into his courts with praise.*

*Give thanks to him
and praise his name.*

Psalm 100:4

On this Thanksgiving Day, we Americans are encouraged to pause and give thanks to God. In his Thanksgiving Proclamation of 1863, President Abraham Lincoln wrote, "The year that is drawing toward its close has been filled with the blessings of fruitful fields and healthful skies. To these bounties, which are so constantly enjoyed that we are prone to forget the source from which they come, others have been added which are of so extraordinary a nature that they cannot fail to penetrate and soften even the heart which is habitually insensible to the ever-watchful providence of Almighty God."

President Lincoln wrote these words in a very dark time of our history. In 1863, the war was not going well. Yet, in the midst of such a challenging time, President Lincoln called upon Americans to remember the richness of God's blessings, and to be thankful. And so it should



be with us.

The last several years have been especially difficult for our nation and this after almost a decade and one half of being at war. Many in our nation are hurting economically and, as a church, we have had many challenges. So, we need to hear the encouragement of Abraham Lincoln again. In spite of our challenges and setbacks, we have been richly blessed by God in this country, in our church, and in our lives. Thanks-giving is due just as much today as it was in 1863, and perhaps, much more.

When we give thanks, we bring to mind God's gifts to us. This, in turn, reminds us of God's grace. We think, not just of what God has done, but also of who God is. Though there is no rule saying that thanksgiving must come before praise, it is a helpful practice. Thanksgiving is a point of entry to praise.

In the language of Psalm 100, we enter God's gates with thanksgiving, so that we might

go into his courts with praise. Paul says something very similar when he encourages us to pray "with thanksgiving," (Philippians 4:6), thanking our Lord, even before we get our answer, because we know that our God looks after us and works for our good, no matter what. This in turn helps us to continue "rejoicing in the Lord always." Thus, thanks-

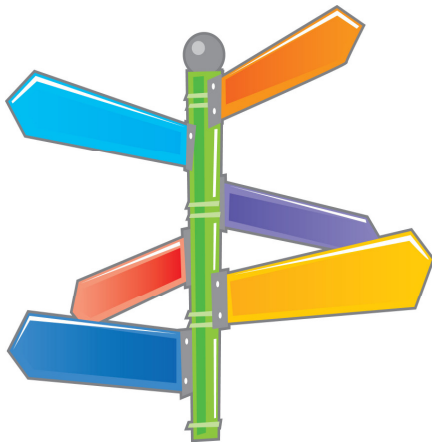
giving is a great attitude adjustment. We can never be joyful or happy unless we are thankful.

On the Road to Finding a New Pastor: The Pastor Nominating Committee



Your Pastor Nominating Committee (PNC) has been very busy and productive. Our first order of business was to complete the Minister Information Form (MIF). The MIF is basically a very detailed job description. This task was completed with particular attention given to carefully composing the narrative questions.

The MIF was approved by our session and then went to the Presbytery, where it was reviewed and approved by the Committee on Ministry. Subsequently, Northminster Presbyterian Church was assigned an ID number which allowed us to post the job listing on the church's internet network.

Incredibly, within 24 hours, our church received 24 applicants. (There will be many more to come.)

The PNC is currently in the process of preparing a comprehensive list of questions which will be used when interviewing candidates. The questions are designed to ensure that our new pastor will be compatible with our church's doctrinal beliefs and goals. Applicants will be rated and then, narrowed down to a short list of those who will be interviewed.

The work of the PNC is challenging, exciting, extremely important, and, at the same time, rewarding. Stay tuned for further reports on our progress to find the right pastor to lead our church.

Resurrection House



Founded by six local churches, Resurrection House is now supported by more than 30 religious entities.

Resurrection House is a forward thinking, faith-based resource center committed to transitioning at-risk individuals to a path of self-sufficiency. A 501(c)(3) non-profit, faith-based organization, it serves as a day resource center to the homeless of Sarasota County, Florida. Their services include showers, restrooms, laundry, counseling, medical treatment, food, clothing, veteran's assistance, post office, phone, and more

Since it was founded in 1989, Resurrection House has seen over 30,000 individual clients.

Resurrection House, is the designated recipient for our Local Mission gifts for the last quarter of 2016. To make your donation, please check the Local Mission box on your offering envelope or use the special Mission Envelope in your Sunday Bulletin.

In addition to this quarterly mission offering, Northminster collects "hotel size" toiletries to donate to this mission. These can be left in the bin outside the church offices or, on Sundays, in the Narthex.

The Presbyterian Church in Kirkuk, Iraq



Tens of thousands of Christians fled – by car, by bus, on foot – seeking shelter wherever they could find it.

Presbyterian Church in Kirkuk is about 100 miles from Mosul in a stable Kurdish-controlled area. The church has always been involved in a vibrant ministry to the people in the area, but in 2014 everything changed. In the streets around town, entire families stood dazed and bewildered, clutching small parcels of their personal belongings.

ISIS had taken Mosul and had pressed on into the nearby Nineveh Plain. Ahead of them fled tens of thousands of Christians – by car, by bus, on foot – seeking shelter wherever they could find it. More than 70 of them ended up living in the Presbyterian Church in Kirkuk, where every classroom and office became a small apartment. They are all still there and, with the help of other Christians all over the world, the church continues to help them, as best they can.

Although the tragic events in Iraq from the summer of 2014 have mostly faded from our daily news cycles, the past is very much present for Rev. Haitham Jazrawi and his congregation at the Presbyterian Church in Kirkuk.

What can we do to help? Though we cannot be there in person, our gifts go a long way to help this church and, through them, the people to whom they minister. It is on the front lines of God's work in that area and is doing magnificent work there responding to the needs of Christians and Muslims who fled their homes when ISIS invaded.

In addition to supporting refugees, the church runs a full-time school, which is attended by Christian and Muslim children, and is a great witness for Christ to the Muslims in the whole area.

All Faiths Food Bank

All Faiths Food Bank is the hub of hunger relief in Sarasota and DeSoto Counties. They pick up donated food, sort it, fill partner agency orders, deliver to 184 agencies and programs that distribute the food, and host mobile pantries that give food directly to clients in need. AFFB provides food for 51,000 residents every year; families with children, the elderly, the unemployed, and the low-income earners.

Please remember to bring donations of canned or boxed food staples and place them in the yellow barrel in the Narthex. *Please do not donate anything in glass containers.*

DECK THE HALLS

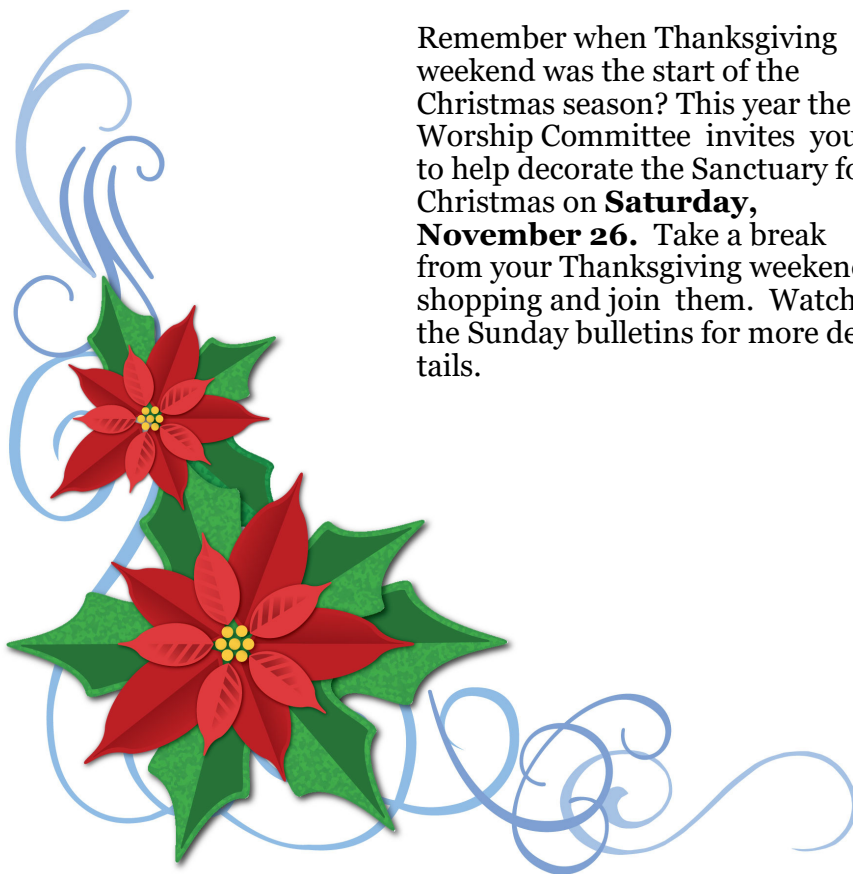

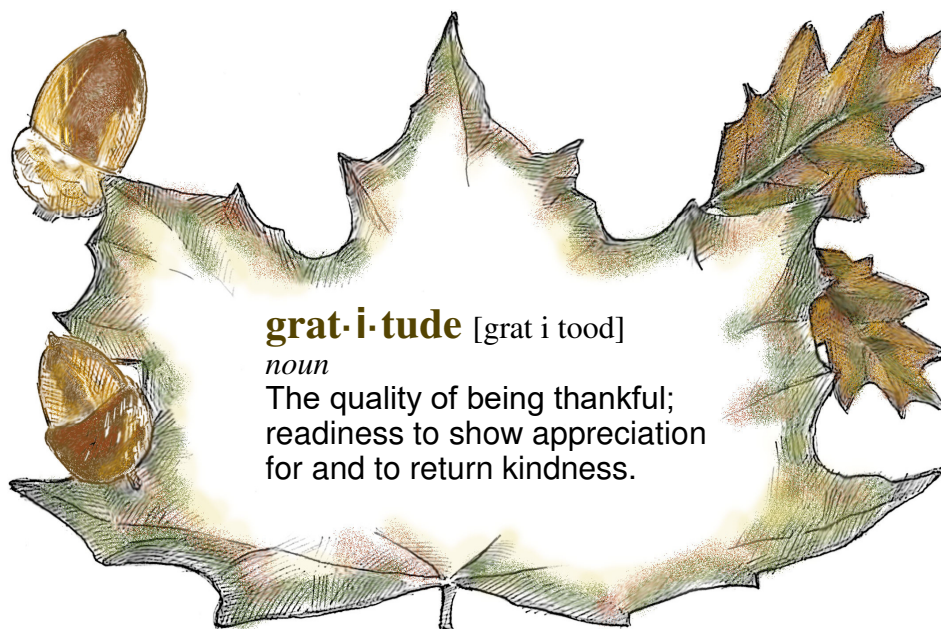

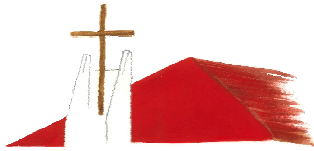
