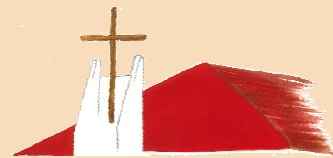

M. Scott Peck tells a story about a woman who was suffering with tremendous depression. Nothing he talked to her about or did seemed to help. One day she had an appointment with him and she needed a ride. So he picked her up and said to her, "I've got an errand to run and while I am on my errand, here are three people in a hospital I want you to go and see, nearby." So while he was doing his errand, she went and visited these three people. When she got back, she was just ecstatic. She was beaming because she had such a wonderful experience. This great psychologist looked at her and said, "Now that we know how to treat your depression, let's set up a regular time to do just this." She looked at him and said, "Do I have to go do it again?" We are all like that sometimes, aren't we? We don't mind serving, as long as there is an end date that when we can be done by and have our life back.

My friends, one of the biggest misconceptions we have is that our lives belong to us. The fact is, our lives are not our own. We belong to God. And one of the reasons God has put us here is to serve him and

others. That doesn't mean we don't take care of our jobs or families. It does not mean we never have fun or take a vacation. We can serve in our jobs, and we can serve him in our families, as well. We serve in all kinds of ways, even taking a vacation. The point is, our lives are about serving. It is our purpose, not a temporary thing we do and, then, get back to living our lives for ourselves.

God has given us everything, and we are to give back. It starts by realizing that life is all about God and loving him. Everything flows from that. If we have that priority, everything else will fall into place. If we don't, our lives will inevitably get off track. So, as you think about your life, think about why you are here: that you are not an accident, that God has placed you here for this time, this place, and his purpose. As you begin a new year, ask God what he would have you be and do and give. Then follow where he leads.

## Each One, Bring One



Northminster has a mission statement. You know it because we sing it often at the end of Sunday services. “God calls us; God sends us; God is the center of our life.” But what does God call us to do and where does God send us? The Bible study classes of “Becoming a Contagious Church” have tweaked the mission statement to fit their plan for growing worship service attendance, as follows: “God calls us to serve him; God sends us to tell others about him.”

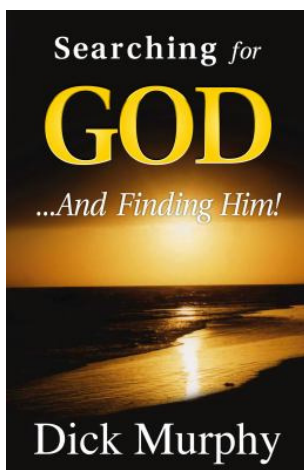
By now you have seen several people in the church wearing a badge that says “I Am a Contagious Christian.” The badges are being worn by those who have made a commitment to tell others about Jesus by inviting them to a church function. It is a commitment that is well within their ability, but it does require prayer and being in partnership with God. It is based on a simple undertaking: “Each one, bring one.” Think of it. If each member of our church would bring just one unchurched person to church over the next twelve months – just one – the snowball effect that that could

have on church attendance would be amazing, and it would be a beacon of light to our obedient response to the Great Commission of Matthew 28: *Go! Baptize them! And teach them to obey!*”

Our prayer is that you will join us. If you, too, would like to make a commitment to bring just one unchurched person to a church function sometime over the next twelve months, we will provide you with a badge. The badges are worn at church functions, including worship service, as a reminder to us and the congregation of our commitment. Even if you do not join us, we ask that you pray for us. Only if we are in partnership with God can our campaign be successful—and that means prayer, and lots of it. Please pray unceasingly for those wearing the badge. Pray that God will open a door to an unchurched person; that God will soften the heart of that person so that they are receptive to an invitation; and that God will open our mouths and give us the courage to ask them to come.

**Living a Culture of Generosity** is the focus of our campaign this year. The Bible makes many promises about giving, and each of us must decide what joyful commitment we will make for the stewardship of our church.

Paul, in Corinthians 9:7, tells us that *“each one must give as he (or she) has decided in his (or her) heart, not reluctantly or under compulsion, for God loves a cheerful Giver.”*

Our 2017 campaign begins January 15, when we introduce *Growing Our Culture of Generosity in 2017*. A few days later you will receive your 2017 stewardship brochure and a pledge card in the mail. We are planning to share information and great experiences church members have had with their giving. The campaign will complete on January 29, our commitment Sunday, when we will prayerfully give our pledges for the coming year.

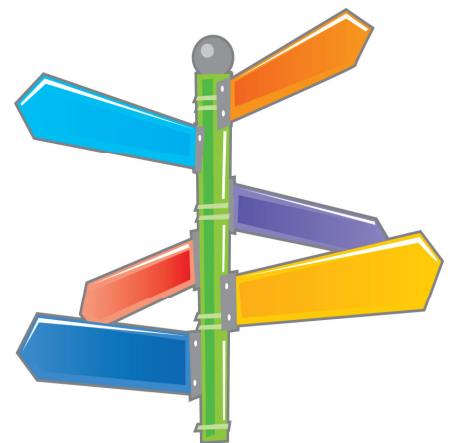
## On the Road to Finding a New Pastor: The Pastor Nominating Committee

The Northminster Presbyterian Church Pastor Nominating Committee (PNC), continues to make good progress in their search for our new pastor. To date, eighty applicants have been thoroughly reviewed by the committee and evaluations were made based on each candidate's merits and compatibility with our church's demographics and goals. The net result of all this work is that we have narrowed down our list to six strong candidates that we would like to interview.

But before the interviews take place, each candidate must be thoroughly vetted by our Presbytery. Once they are approved, our objective is to conduct an inter-

view with each person in a face-to-face situation, or by using an Internet application such as Skype. A carefully prepared list of questions has been tailor – made for each candidate. It should be noted that the interviews will not be a one-sided process. Not only are we looking for the right leader, but each candidate will be looking for the right church.

If all goes well, we hope to have completed the introductory interviews with the top candidates by the time you read this. There is much excitement among the committee members as we try to find the perfect match for our church. We will certainly keep you updated as the search continues.

Syrian refugee camp near Kirkuk.

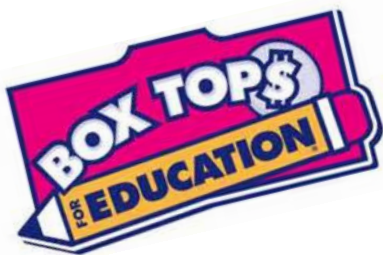
In 2014, ISIS took the city of Mosul and pressed into the nearby Nineveh Plain. Ahead of them fled tens of thousands of Christians, seeking shelter wherever they could find it. More than 70 of them ended up living in the **Presbyterian Church in Kirkuk**, where every classroom and office became a small apartment. They are all still there. With the help of other Christians all over the world, the church continues to help them, as best they can.

Although the tragic events in Iraq from the summer of 2014 have mostly faded from our daily news cycles, the past is very much present for Rev. Haitham Jazrawi and his congregation at the Presbyterian Church in Kirkuk.

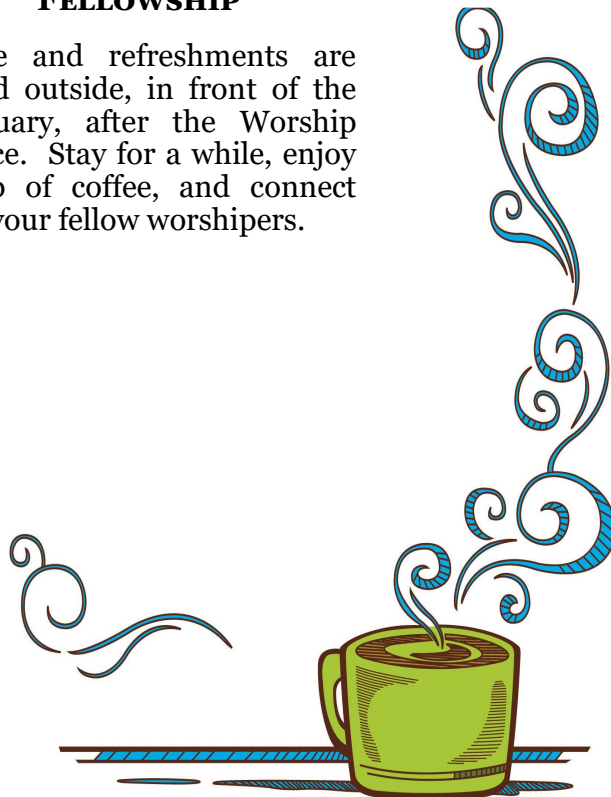
### FREE TECH HELP

If you wish you knew how to use your iPhone, computer, or tablet, and don't know who to ask, this individual training is for you!

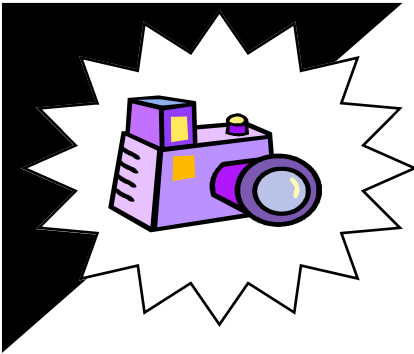
Just bring your device to the Fellowship Hall at **1:00 on Monday afternoons** and **David Stoltie** will be glad to help you.

## Hearing Assistance

Northminster's Sanctuary is equipped with a **Hearing Loop** which magnetically transmits sound to hearing aids and cochlear implants with telecoils (T-coils). Talk to your hearing aid provider about installing a T-coil in your hearing aid - *OR you may already have a T-coil that only needs to be activated!*

A limited number of headphones, for use with the Hearing Loop system, are available from the ushers.

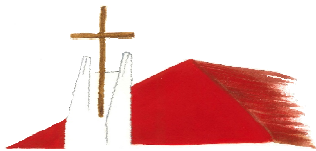
