Dear Friends,

What can you do to help grow our church? I want to encourage you to do something very simple, yet incredibly effective; something most of us are good at and practice on a regular basis. In a word, I want to encourage you to practice the Gospel by Hospitality.

Most of us are good at hospitality. We often have people into our homes; and we are very good at that. We know how to make people feel welcomed and wanted: we greet them; we offer them something to eat; we get them a drink; we introduce them to other people; we offer them a comfortable place to sit. It is the same with our church home. When new people come, we want them to feel welcomed and wanted. So, we practice hospitality. We greet them; we can help them find a place to sit; we introduce them to others, etc. It really is that simple.

We have all heard of the famous phrase, "Build it and they will come." It is true that since we built our new Sanctuary many people have visited to check us out. Many churches grow just by making sure they help those who visit feel welcomed and wanted on Sunday morning. Well, of course it takes much more than that. If we are intentional and practice good hospitality, it is likely many will stay and join us on our faith journey, here at Northminster.



Of course to grow our church, we need to do other things as well. One of the very powerful programs Northminster will be doing over the next four years is "Each One Bring One." The idea is very simple. Would you commit to bringing one non-churched person to church each year for the next four years? Of course you can bring more, but would you commit to just one? The person you invite may or may not be a Christian, but for some reason he or she does not belong to a church. Members of other churches do not count. We do not want to "steal sheep" from other churches. How do you do that? Just be hospitable. We do not hesitate to invite others to eat with us. We do not hesitate to tell them some wonderful news we have heard. In this case, we commit to telling others about our church and inviting them - no forcing, no buttonholing, just inviting.

The Presbyterian Church in Kirkuk, Iraq

In 2014, ISIS took the city of Mosul and pressed into the nearby Nineveh Plain. Ahead of them fled tens of thousands of Christians, seeking shelter wherever they could find it. More than 70 of them ended up living in the Presbyterian Church in Kirkuk, where every classroom and office became a small apartment. They are all still there. With the help of other Christians all over the world, the church continues to help them, as best they can.

In addition, Rev. Haitham Jazrawi reports that there is still an influx of refugees, mainly women, children, seniors, and the disabled. (The able -bodied men are being forced to join ISIS.) They flee in the middle of the night, in freezing winter temperatures. The church has distributed heavy winter blankets to refugees living in the street and in UN camps.

Beth-El Farmworkers Ministry

Beth-El Mission is located in Wimauma, Florida, where the agricultural industry is one of the largest employers. 70% of the population is Latino and more than half of them are under the age of 30.

Some of these young people follow their parents into the fields, while others pursue an advanced education. Many feel themselves adrift between two cultures and have expressed frustration that they do not have a place of worship that provides an outlet that addresses their faith within the complexities of the world in which they live. That is why the mission believes the time is right to begin a new young adult ministry for this unique community; a ministry to nurture spiritual development and help individuals navigate life between two diverse cultures.

Beth-El continues to offer programs for worship, a food pantry, education, meals, camps for children, and counseling.


FREE TECH HELP

Hearing Assistance

Northminster's Sanctuary is equipped with a **Hearing Loop** which magnetically transmits sound to hearing aids and cochlear implants with telecoils (T-coils). Midday Music Presents David Allen Wehr in Concert

Northminster's 2017 Midday Music Concert Series continues on **February 10**, with a concert by pianist **David Allen Wehr**.

All concerts are held in Northminster's sanctuary and last one hour, beginning at noon. They are free and open to the public. A Meet-the-Artist reception, in the Fellowship Hall, will follow each performance.

Mr. Wehr has been called by the *New York Times* "a man who so strongly believes in his ideas that they come across as statements of musical fact," and the *American Record Guide* "more than a pianist's pianist; he is a musician's musician." He holds the Jack W. Geltz Distinguished Piano Chair at Duquesne University in Pittsburgh, Pennsylvania.

Since winning the Gold Medal at the 1987 Santander International Piano Competition in Spain, he has toured in over thirty countries in Europe, the Far East, and North and South America. Mr. Wehr has been soloist with the London Symphony, the National Symphony, the Houston, Chautauqua, New Zealand symphonies, and all the major Spanish and Latin American orchestras. He toured for thirteen seasons with Community Concerts as recitalist, member of the Sartory Trio, and pianist with violinist Linda Wang and cellist Zuill Bailev, and has recorded 20 albums with Connoisseur Society, including the complete Beethoven Sonata Cycle. He is in great demand as presenter and judge for national and international piano competitions.
