Here we are in September already! Time has flown by. As I write this, Joyce and I have just returned from vacation! We had a great time and it was very relaxing! It was great to recharge our batteries. I find I need those times!

September will bring the return of our Fall Bible Studies. Stay tuned for the start dates for Dick Murphy's Sunday and Thursday morning classes. I will begin my Tuesday Studies on Oct. 2. Why so late? I have a week of Study leave in September and then a trip to Cuba late in the month.

I will be going to Cuba with about 28 others from our Presbytery. Pray for this trip as we hope to make inroads into the actual partnership with a sister congregation there.

I have been reading a book on Spiritual disciplines and another on Restoring our Passion. One discipline they both focus on is the importance of solitude and quiet times. You find several times where Jesus went apart to spend time alone with his Father. Forty days in the wilderness - the mountaintop after the feeding of the 5,000, and Gethsemane, come to mind. I am struck by the importance of this to Jesus. How much more important should it be for me?

One of my takeaways from the summer is the intentional building of quiet times into my daily schedule as a way of preparing for the increased demands of pastoral life during the "season."



You are familiar with the words of Psalm 46:10, as I use them often with you. It is the invitation to "be still and know that I am God." The surrounding context is important. The invitation to be still comes at a time when the earth is changing, the mountains shake in the heart of the sea, and there is chaos all around. That is when we find the invitation to be still. It is in being still, the Psalmist tells us, that we will find that God is still exalted in the earth.

May God grant to all of us the waters of refreshing that come, not from trying to get a sip from a fire hose, but from the still waters to which the Good Shepherd leads us.

Our reading of the Essential 100 Stories of the Bible will conclude this month. Pastor Wally continues to lead a discussion of the previous week's readings **at 9:00, on Sundays, in the Fellowship Hall.**

ELIJAH AND ELISHA

Elijah and Elisha are coming to Northminster this fall through the teaching of **Dick Murphy**. The class will be offered twice weekly; **Sundays at 9:00, starting September 16, and Thursdays at 10:00, starting September 20.**

These two great prophets were called by God at a time in the Old Testament when God's chosen people were breaking God's Covenant and worshipping the foreign gods of Baal and Asherah. The prophets were sent to remind the people of the consequences of their disobedience and to beg the people to repent and turn back to God before it was too late. The prophets fought the good fight and kept winning the battles but losing the war. The people were too headstrong, stubborn, and corrupt to change their ways. God eventually had no choice but to bring to an end the special blessings he promised the people. It would be sad news for the Israelites, but good news for the world, because it culminated in the coming of Jesus Christ.

The two great prophets of God show us that little has changed in the past 3,000 years. People are still worshipping false gods. Like the Old Testament people, America and the world are on the precipice of either stopping their disobedience and turning to God or facing the consequences of a lost and broken world. Jesus is our prophet, priest, and king who begs the world to turn to God. Christians are the answer.

Mission Offerings,

Helping the Hungry

At Northminster, we support many different ministries and recently have been asked why we are collecting food for both the Blessing Box and All Faiths Food Bank and how are they different?

The Blessing Box is a neighborhood outreach to provide a simple act of kindness to anyone passing our doors. It's sign reads, "Been Blessed - Leave One. Need Blessing - Take One." The recipients of these blessings may be someone waiting on the bus to go to work, may be someone walking to nearby shopping centers, or may be a homeless person. We don't know who they are, but they have passed by our church and were in need of something we left in the Blessing Box. Your donations of individually packaged, single-serve, food and drinks can be left in the red bin, in the Narthex. We have noticed that other people and Metro Diner have also been contributing to the Blessing Box. It's wonderful to have neighborhood involvement!

All Faiths Food Bank is a larger mission which serves more than 160 shelters and facilities that serve the needs of the homeless, and low-income families in need of food. Their outreach is to all of Sarasota and DeSoto Counties. We collect food staples in the big yellow barrel in the Narthex. Our monthly donations average 140 pounds of food.

Both of these missions are important causes for Northminster to support. Your contributions are greatly appreciated. *We are greatly Blessed to be a Blessing!*

BIBLE MISSION USA

"I send out my Word and it always produces fruit. It will accomplish all I want it to, and prosper everywhere I send it." (John 21:17)

Dr. Paul Eckel's contemporary translation of the Gospel of John, has been distributed to over 24,000 people in the past four years. The Spanish version is being widely distributed to Latino farmworkers in Beth-El and Immokalee. Manatee County's Habitat for Humanity is fieldtesting the Gospel of John as a house-warming gift for residents of Habitat homes. Northminster provides the Gospel of John in our visitors' packages and stocks the Blessing Box with both English and Spanish versions. The demand is great and the inventory of books must be replenished.

A radio program, *Changing Lives*, with Dr. Paul Eckel, is being proposed as a weekly show on popular Christian stations. Dr. Eckel will use this platform for teaching John's Gospel.

Mark will be the next Gospel to be translated from Greek into conversational English. This translation will also provide guidance to help the reader understand what is being read.

Donors and volunteers are being sought for all of these Bible Mission USA projects, and more. A portion of your gifts to Northminster's Mission Fund are directed, by the Mission Committee, to support BMUSA. So far, this year, Northminster has sent them \$1,851.





Gifts, and Action

FREE WHEELCHAIR MISSION

Seventy million people are in need of a wheelchair, but cannot afford one. Northminster supports Free Wheelchair Mission, international nonprofit an organization that provides "the transforming gift of mobility to the physically disabled poor in developing countries, as moti-vated by Jesus Christ." A wheelchair provides so much more than simple mobility; it provides independence, the ability to participate in society and earn a living; and it provides dignity, lifting people off of the ground.

SAFE PLACE AND RAPE CRISIS CENTER

SPARCC is the only statecertified center for domestic violence and sexual assault services for Sarasota and DeSoto Counties. They provide a 24hour crisis hotline, emergency shelter, and multiple services for survivors of abuse. In addition, SPARCC is actively engaged, through community education programs, in addressing and changing social norms that support violence against women.

In addition to monetary support, we collect used cell phones (and chargers) to be refurbished and programmed to serve as 911 phones to help those in crisis.

SPARCC's Treasure Chest, at 1426 Fruitville Road, is another way to support this cause. Donate clothing or household items or go there to shop! All *Treasure Chest proceeds* are used to fund programs and services provided by SPARCC.

DAY4HOPE THANK YOU

In July, Northminster partnered with two churches, Church of the Palms Presbyterian and First United Methodist Church, on their Day4hope events, sending several volunteers from our congregation and donating \$1,800.

Volunteer Coordinator, **Judy Egan**, sends the following:

"On behalf of Pastor Wally, the Outreach Committee, and Day4Hope, I would like to thank everyone who gave of their time and energy, and those who supported this program to bring food, backpacks and services to children who are homeless in our community. We have just scratched the surface, but over 350 children were impacted by this program in the two churches with which we partnered. Many more were impacted by the 31 local churches that participated. Thank you all and may God's work continue to grow at Northminster and within our community.
