Pastor's Corner

Lent is upon us and that means that Holy Week is right around the corner. Lent is a season, in the church, that is not mentioned in the Bible. Some would say that we should not observe it because of that. For me, and others, it is a wonderful time to remember and reflect on the suffering of our Lord and the call to take up our cross and follow him.

On Ash Wednesday, we will have a Soup Dinner and Communion Service at 5:30. The imposition of the ashes is a sobering reminder that we are to live all of life under the shadow of the cross. In this season, the shadow of the cross looms large.

During Lent, beginning on March 13, we will have a Wednesday Soup Lunch and Bible Study. We will start at noon and finish by 1:00. We will be using a video series entitled "Embracing Forgiveness," by Barbara Crafton. I think you will enjoy it. To make the schedule work we will *not* have Tuesday Bible Study from March 5, until after Easter.

During Lent, it is a common practice to give something up. Often, this becomes a source of spiritual pride in and of itself. The practice of giving something up is to serve the larger practice of adding something good to our daily practices. Perhaps that is a spiritual discipline or a good deed that we feel called to. The giving up is best done as a means to give ourselves *to* something else.



The basin and the towel is a powerful image, for me. It represents the call of Christ to servanthood. The call is to community! We have many opportunities to listen to the call of God as it comes to each of us! May we listen to that call!

Welcome to the Planet

Every Sunday worship service in March, beginning March 3, will be dedicated to those who are seeking God or are seeking to know him better. Pastor Wally will be preaching on sermons that relate to "Why we exist, who God is, reasons to believe in Jesus Christ, and how Christianity can change lives now and forever more."

This is an excellent time to invite your unchurched friends. God commands all Christians to spread the good news of Jesus Christ. Embracing Forgiveness

Starting on Wednesday, March 6, this five-week class will explore the topic of Forgiveness. The video series, by author Barbara Cawthorne Crafton, shares stories and insights on forgiveness, what it is and isn't, why it's so badly needed, and how employing simple, concrete practices can integrate forgiveness into our lives.

The classes are from noon-1:00 and will be held in the Fellowship Hall. "Soups that you love" will be served, by the Fellowship Committee, at the beginning of each session. Look for the sign-up clipboard on Sundays in the Narthex or, during the week, in the church office.

We are not asking congregational members to go out and evangelize. We are asking those who know someone who doesn't go to church to invite them. Invitational evangelism works best when you say a quick prayer, take a deep breath, open your mouth, and let it rip. If you do not know anyone who is unchurched, then please pray daily for those who do. Pray that God will prepare their hearts to respond favorably to the invitation. And stay alert that God may put someone in your path that he wants you to invite.



We are pleased to welcome Rose to the Northminster family.






How to Join

Mission Ministry

THE PRESBYTERIAN CHURCH OF KIRKUK, IRAQ

Approximately 40 Syrian refugees are still housed in the Kirkuk Presbyterian church. where classrooms and offices have become small apartments. The Kirkuk Church has managed to not only minister to these refugees, but also to refugees in churches and camps elsewhere in northern Iraq. The Church still continues its regular programs, including a Kindergarten and Child Care Center.

Resurrection House

Resurrection House is a faith-based resource center committed to transitioning at-risk individuals to a path of self-sufficiency. It serves as a day resource center to the homeless with services that include showers, restrooms, laundry, counseling, medical treatment, food, clothing, veteran's assistance, and more. They'd like donations of unisex shampoos and soap—no other toiletries, at this time.

SAFE PLACE AND RAPE CRISIS CENTER

SPARCC is the only state-certified center for domestic violence and sexual assault services for Sarasota and DeSoto Counties. They provide a 24-hour crisis hotline, emergency shelter, and multiple services for survivors of abuse. In addition, SPARCC is actively engaged, education through community addressing programs, in and changing social norms that support violence against women. We collect used cell phones, phone chargers, and accessories to be refurbished and programmed to serve as 911 phones for those in crisis



KIDS AGAINST HUNGER Meal-Packing Event

We will be working with Kids Against Hunger for a meal-packing event, following worship service on **March 3.** This is the second Meal Packing for us; our first was in May 2018. If you participated or talked to anyone who participated last year, you will know how easy and fun this project is! You can even do it sitting down! You will love doing this project together and feel good about making a difference!

BLESSING BOX

Last year a notable addition was made to Northminster's local mission effort. The Blessing Box, standing prominently in front of the sanctuary, next to the busstop, provides food, sometimes toiletries, and Bible Mission USA's Gospel of John, to people who pass by our church every day.

Food items and bottled water are needed on a continuing basis to support this ministry to our neighbors. Donations can be left in the red tub in the Narthex.

A NOTE ABOUT BETH-EL DONATIONS

Beth-El has been inundated by donations of household items and all types of clothing. They cannot process all that they have.

At this time they are accepting only the following clothing, in small and medium sizes: white t-shirts, long-sleeved shirts, jeans, new underwear, socks, work shoes or boots, and baseball caps.
