THE BLESSING BOX

ALL FAITHS FOOD BANK

AFFB is the hub of hunger relief in Sarasota county, providing food for families with children, the elderly, the unemployed, and low-income earners. month a yellow barrel full of food is picked up from the Narthex. Monthly collections weigh anywhere from 120 to over 200 pounds. Some of the most needed items are: rice, dried fruit beans. canned and vegetables, canned meat and tuna, peanut butter, jelly, pasta, and canned tomato sauce. Please do not donate food in glass containers.

SAFE PLACE AND RAPE CRISIS CENTER



BETH-EL FARMWORKERS MINISTRY

Beth-El helps farm workers achieve self-sufficiency through its open opportunities to worship, its extensive education programs, and the many services it provides to meet basic needs. Among its core programs are worship, a food pantry, education, meals, camps for children, and counseling. In addition to financial support, Northminster collects clothing for the workers: specifically pants, white t-shirts, underwear, work boots, socks, and baseball caps.

THE PRESBYTERIAN CHURCH OF KIRKUK

Approximately forty Syrian refugees are still housed in the Kirkuk Presbyterian church, where classrooms and offices have became small apartments. The Kirkuk Church has managed to not only minister to these refugees, but also to refugees in churches and camps elsewhere in northern Iraq. Northminster helps to provide support for their relief efforts.

RESURRECTION HOUSE

Resurrection House is celebrating 30 years as a resource center committed to transitioning atrisk individuals to a path of self-sufficiency. It serves as a day resource center to the homeless with services that include showers, restrooms, laundry, counseling, medical treatment, food, clothing, veteran's assistance, post office, phone, and more.

INAUGURAL PIANO CONCERT

On Sunday, **November 24**, at 3 p.m., we will be treated to a concert featuring our new Steinway Piano, in the capable hands of our own Sylvia Eckes and Gail Ofterdinger-Ledgister.

Sylvia is a Professor Emerita of Piano at Ohio University and has been knighted in Norway for her studies on Edvard Grieg, the prominent Norwegian composer of the 1800s.

Gail earned a BA in piano performance and an MA in music history. She has studied in Vienna and Rome and played the organ at the Vatican.

This is a rare treat and everyone is encouraged to come and enjoy these talented women play our new Steinway. A freewill offering will be taken to help offset the renovation costs of our "new" piano.

INTRODUCING THE STEINWAY

Northminster purchased a 1969, L model, Steinway grand piano earlier this year. It was soon given to the care of nationally-prominent piano technician, Justin Elliott, to renovate. He rebuilt the action (ask one of our music staff or Sylvia Eckes to explain that) and installed it early in October. The music staff feels fortunate to have an instrument that responds to a wide range of expression and brings a spiritual message to listeners.


CHRISTMAS POT LUCK DINNER



Capital Campaign Report

Several years ago, the Capital Campaign Building Fund was started to raise money to build a new sanctuary. The one that we now occupy.

As part of the Capital Campaign, Jack Tibbitts and I, served on what was called "the Bridge Team." It was our responsibility to keep the church members informed of significant events as we periodically reduced the principal balance of the mortgage.

At that time, after raising \$800,000 in pledges from the congregation, through a capital fund drive, we borrowed almost \$1,200,000., to build this \$2,000,000 church. We have been diligently reducing the principal amount, over the last six years, to a balance on the loan of less than \$197,000. Now, after applying \$50,000 from the matching funds ap-

peal at the end of last year, we owe under \$143,000!!

It is the hope and prayer of the finance committee to pay the remaining outstanding balance of the mortgage this year.

By eliminating the monthly mortgage payment, we will free the church to continue to do the work God is calling us to do in this portion of his world.

If you are willing to help us with completing this dream, please contact **Jim Christie**, **Bob Price**, **Barry Ladd or myself**. We will be very glad to help you making this dream come true.
