Mission Ministry

THE BLESSING BOX

We never know what someone needs at any particular moment. Your donations of food and water are welcome and vital to the continuation of this ministry. Please leave your contributions in the red bin, in the Narthex. May you be blessed!

All Faiths Food Bank

AFFB is the hub of hunger relief in Sarasota county, providing food for families with children, the elderly, the unemployed, and low-income earners. Every month a yellow barrel full of food is picked up from the Narthex. Monthly collections weigh anywhere from 120 to over 200 pounds. Some of the most needed items are: rice, dried beans, canned fruit and vegetables, canned meat and tuna, peanut butter, jelly, pasta, and canned tomato sauce. Please do not donate food in glass containers.

Resurrection House

Resurrection House is celebrating 30 years as a resource center committed to transitioning at-risk individuals to a path of self-sufficiency. It serves as a day resource center to the homeless with services that include showers, restrooms, laundry, counseling, medical treatment, food, clothing, veteran's assistance, post office, phone, and more.

SALVATION ARMY ANGEL TREE

The Angel Tree went up last month, and almost all the Angel tags were claimed the first week! If you didn't get a bag, when you selected your child, you can pick up one in the Sanctuary or church office.

Once you've gone shopping, return the presents in the special bag. The stub from you tag goes in the bottom of the bag and the main tag needs to be securely taped to the outside. Instructions are on the back of the Angel tag. **Bring in your gifts by Sunday, December 8.** The Salvation Army will pick them up on Tuesday, December 10.

CHRISTMAS JOY Offering

Through the Christmas Joy Offering, the PC(USA) supports current and retired church leaders who require financial assistance.
