



Mission Ministry

CHRIST CALLS US, CHRIST SENDS US

The Mission Committee coordinates various mission activities throughout the year It is in charge of distributing the money received for the Mission Fund to our established missions and to other charities, as the need arises.

During last year, Northminster's general mission fund gave to four local organizations: Beth -El Farmworkers Ministry; Bible Mission, USA; Resurrection House; and Safe Place and Rape Crisis Center; and to the Outreach Foundation for the Presbyterian Church in Kirkuk, Iraq. After Hurricane Dorian devastated the Bahamas, Northminster members gave generously and funds were sent to the PC(USA), the Salvation Army, and Agape Flights to assist in hurricane relief efforts.

Special projects last year included, a meal–packing event with Kids Against Hunger, in March; Operation Shoebox for deployed service members; and the Salvation Army Angel Tree. The Presbyterian Women collected bathing suits and towels for disadvantaged kids attending Cedarkirk Summer Camp.


NEIGHBORHOOD MISSION
