Here we go with Lent for 2020. The season of Lent is not mentioned in Scripture. For this reason, some dismiss it as without merit. I think the season of Lent is good and proper because it is a call for us to remember our humanity and our constant need of God's grace.

Some use the season of Lent to give things up. You will hear the question, "What did you give up for Lent?" I think the value of giving something up is not that we earn brownie points with God, but that the denial of the familiar reminds us of the call of the season to return to God with our whole hearts.

I would encourage you to add a practice of spiritual discipline in the place of what you give up. What a wonderful season which reminds us our lives here are temporary, and we are to live in light of eternity! Teach us to number our days, O Lord.



During Lent, we will not have our normal Pastor's Bible Study at 10 on Tuesdays. Instead, we will have a Lent Lunch Series in which we will have a soup lunch or light lunch while we watch a video series by N.T. Wright entitled, "Surprised by Hope." We will watch the video and then discuss the theme of hope each week. I am looking forward to this time each week.

During Holy Week we will have a more traditional Maundy Thursday Service at 5:30, Good Friday Service at noon, and Easter Sunday at 10:30. If you want to join me in the annual Good Friday Stations of the Cross in downtown Sarasota that begins at 8 and is a great way to begin Good Friday.

Some of the most needed items are: rice, dried beans, canned fruit and vegetables, canned meat and tuna, peanut butter, jelly, pasta, and canned tomato sauce. Please do not donate food in glass containers.


# THE BLESSING BOX


# ONE GREAT HOUR OF SHARING
