# Pastor's Corner

Dear Friends,

Over ten years ago, Presbyterian Pastor and writer Robert Henderson wrote about a Presbyterian preacher in Pennsylvania 250 years ago, "who stirred up a 'hornets' nest' by going around preaching on The Dangers of an Unconverted Ministry.' According to church historians, he wasn't too polished or gracious in the way he preached this, but he got results in the form of an 'awakening' and new life into the moribund Presbyterian family."

Henderson goes on to say that it is still not a theme that is cordially received in many "clergy circles." It is as though such talk is sheer pietism or unacceptable evangelical judgmentalism. something or equally beneath us. But, he asks, "How does one deal with scripture, with the teachings of Jesus and the apostles apart from the reality that there is an invitation into the reality of Christ and the salvation he brings, and into the family of faith?" Indeed!

Even more, how does a pastor lead God's flock and not be

able to describe his or her own personal relationship with Christ? "I have found that it is adventuresome somewhat (fun?) and fascinating to sit over coffee with a group of seminary students, or faculty, and ask one of them, 'Tell me how you came to know Jesus? How did you come to follow him?' If they are living 'in Christ' they will light up and tell you their interesting story. If they are not, they will register dismay or anger or noncomprehension. If the pastoral leadership of the Church is not excited about Jesus (translate: unevangelized), then we can hardly expect the people whom they lead to be very much of a help in the mission of God either.'

Henderson's comments are still relevant for both Presbyterian (and many other denominations) clergy and its members as well. In many ways, everything boils down to the question: Do you know Jesus? It is not just a question for fundamentalists, evangelicals or even Baptists. Nor is it a reflection of a particular form of pietism or spiritual su-

periority. It is the most vital question for each person to answer personally. It not only addresses one's eternal destination, but what life is all about and how one lives it. It is also crucial for denominations (including ours) which have memberships that are declining in huge numbers and churches that are closing almost as fast. Without knowing Jesus, churches become akin to social clubs, political organizations, or just places for people to find self-

# **MISSION MINISTRY**



### SAFE PLACE AND Rape Crisis Center: 3rd Quarter Mission

SPARCC provides services to victims of domestic violence and sexual assault in Sarasota and DeSoto counties. Their programs

and services include an emergency shelter, a 24hour hotline, counseling, children's services, transitional housing, and community education. SPARCC is state certified and operates 24 hours a day/365 days a year. All their services are offered free of charge.

You can support this agency by making a donation using the white and blue Mission Envelope or by checking the Local Mission space on your buff pew or offering envelope.

We also collect used cell phones, cell phone chargers, and accessories for SPARCC. These are given to women in crisis who can use them, even without a service contract, to call 911 in event of an emergency. Phones may be left at the Welcome Desk or the church office.

### **Romanian Mission**

Recently we received a letter from Pastor Linda and the Romanian Mission Team of First Presbyterian Church, Howell, MI. Thev appreciate the donations from members of our congregation and the check for \$677 that we sent from our special offering. They relate that the total annual expenses for this mission project is \$30,000. This includes support for the Christian pre-school, a winter food bank, construction, over-the-counter medicines, and incidentals, such as van repair and shipping expenses. Thank you all for your generosity.

### All Faiths Food Bank

From All Faiths Food Bank's Website: "Recent research on child hunger in Sarasota and DeSoto counties reveals that alarming numbers of children are food insecure and worry about the source and quality of their next meal. Commissioned by All Faiths Food



Bank and Gulf Coast Community Foundation, the new study is one of the most comprehensive child-hunger studies ever conducted and gathers information directly from the perspectives of children. The most shocking information we learned is that third-graders are the most concerned about going hungry, worry about the next time they might eat, and what kind of food it will be."

### **FREE WHEELCHAIR MISSION**

Free Wheelchair Mission (FWM) works around the world in partnership with a vast network of



humanitarian, faith-based and government organizations, wheelchairs sending to hundreds of thousands of disabled people, providing not only the gift of mobility, but of dignity, independence, and hope.

It costs \$77.88 to construct and ship the durable all-terrain wheelchair, invented by Dr. Don Schoendorfer, to a disabled person in a developing nation.

Our Committees continue to control expenses, as much as we can, during the normal summer reduction in giving. As reported before, we are operating on a budget that has reduced our planned maintenance expenditures, our support to Peace River Presbytery, and numerous other expenses. Please continue to review your planned giving and, if possible, add to your gifts to our operating fund.

Our Online Giving Program is growing as more and more of us find it a convenient way to insure our gifts arrive each month. We are now receiving 24% of our operating fund pledge money ONLINE!
