## Pastor's Corner

Dear Friends,

In January 1981, I went with a group of other seminarians and Professors to the country of Uganda for the entire month. This was about two years after Idi Amin had been overthrown and the country was still broken and very dangerous. The experience changed my life. I still remember most days and details. I saw the living results of ten years of genocide and terror: orphans of murdered parents eating out of garbage heaps which were as tall as buildings; people with empty eyes and stomachs; broken lives and buildings. I became a missionary through that experience, even though I never received a permanent call to go somewhere outside the U.S. I also became an active advocate for missions, something that has gone with me in every church I have served.

At Northminster, our philosophy is to have a **NARROW FOCUS**, **BIG IMPACT**. Basically we are focusing our efforts on a small number of ministries in order to make a larger impact.

In 2014, we exchanged Bible Mission, USA for Cedarkirk as one of our local missions (We still support Cedarkirk through special offerings). Bible Mission, USA provides God's Word, right

here in our neighborhood, to persons struggling to survive in this frightening world. Through local service organizations, church outreach ministries, and individual sponsors, they joyfully place free Bibles and biblical materials within easy reach of the needy.

In 2016, we are adding the Presbyterian Church in Kirkuk, Iraq, to the international missions we support. The Presbyterian Church in Kirkuk is about 100 miles from Mosul in a stable Kurdish-controlled area. It is doing great work there, responding to the needs of Christians and Muslims who have fled their homes, as well as providing a fulltime school which is attended by both Christian and Muslim children.

So, the four local missions that we are supporting are Resurrection House, Bible Mission USA, Beth-El Farmworker Mission and the Safe Place and Rape Crisis Center (SPARCC). The international missions are Free Wheelchair Mission and the Presbyterian Church in Kirkuk, Iraq.

On Sunday, November 15, we will highlight all four of our local missions. Representatives from these four ministries will speak, during the service, about their work. And

#### **RESURRECTION HOUSE**

While the County and City cannot come to agreement on how to best serve the homeless people in our area, Resurrection House, continues their mission to "restore dignity, productivity, and self-sufficiency to the homeless."

Resurrection House, a faith based agency, is the designated recipient for our Local Mission gifts for the last quarter of 2015. To make your donation, please check the Local Mission box on your offering envelope or use the special Mission Envelope in your Sunday Bulletin.

Throughout the year Northminster also collects "hotel size" toiletries to donate to this mission. These can be left in the bin outside the church offices or, on Sundays, in the Narthex.

#### ALL FAITHS FOOD BANK

From All Faiths Food Bank's Website: "Recent research on child hunger in Sarasota and DeSoto counties reveals that alarming numbers of children are food insecure and worry about the source and quality of their next meal. Commissioned by All Faiths Food Bank and Gulf Coast Community Foundation, the new study is one of the most comprehensive child-hunger studies ever conducted and gathers information directly from the perspectives of children. The most shocking information we learned is that third-graders are the most concerned about

going hungry, worry about the next time they might eat, and what kind of food it will be."

## FREE WHEELCHAIR MISSION X2 CHALLENGE

The simple gift of mobility provides unimaginable opportunities for people living with disabilities in the developing world. Free Wheelchair Mission is lifting people off the ground and giving them the chance to move around independently. The cost of each wheelchair, including shipping, is \$77.88. A group of anonymous supporters pledged to match all gifts received during the months of September and October.

The Northminster congregation rose to the occasion and contributed \$1,207.00 during that time period. Along with the \$1,725.28 received for FWM between January 1 and August 31, you have been responsible for donating 75 wheelchairs.

The work doesn't end here. Another check will be sent to FWM at the end of the year for all donations received during November and December.

#### MEDICAL OMBUDSMAN PROGRAM

Dr. Barry Ladd, a retired family physician, is available Tuesday mornings, by appointment, to see parishioners who have questions about their illnesses and treatment. Dr. Ladd does not diagnose or prescribe treatment. All conversations are free, private, and confidential. Please call the church office for an appointment.

#### LABELS FOR THORNWELL HOME

We collect **the UPC code (bar code)** from several foods, such as: Campbells, Pepperidge Farm, V-8, Franco-American, and Swanson, to send to Thornwell Children's Home. They can redeem these for a variety of supplies. A complete list of eligible product labels is available in the office. *Please cut out the bar code only*—we can't use the whole label.

#### **CELL PHONES FOR SPARCC**

The Safe Place and Rape Crisis Center (SPARCC) provides 24-hour crisis hotline, emergency shelter and counseling for victims of sexual assault and abuse. We will donate your **used cell phones**, cell phone chargers, and accessories to SPARCC. These are given to women in crisis who can use them, even without a service contract, to call 911 in event of an emergency. Please leave your phones at the Welcome Desk or the church office.

## FINANCIAL UPDATE

#### **CATCH UP TIME!**

On Sunday October 25, Finance committee Chair, Barry Ladd, made the following announcement.

Our 2015 operating budget is \$357,450. This money comes to us from pledges and plate collections.

However, it is uneven over the year. From November through March, when our population is large, we are ahead in our collections. From April through October, when our population is small, we are behind in our collections. We follow our progress by comparing current monthly income to the previous year, month by month.

This year we are predicting a short fall of \$25,000. That is a 7% deficit (our government should do as well). It is not because we overspent. It is because the money didn't come in as pledged. We had several generous donors who passed away or moved away and that money will never be collected.

We currently have approximately 220 individual members and 70 nonmembers that contribute on a regular basis. If each of us gave \$100 we would raise \$29,000. Our

church is vibrant and must be supported financially. Those who can, please contribute more to cover those who can't. I will report back in a month to update you.
