

From the Director...

I'm ready for WARM weather! Can I get an **AMEN**!!! What a winter we have had. Because of all of the bad weather, attendance for winter retreats has not been good. We have been concerned with the winter programs for a couple of years now. We are evaluating the need to continue with these winter retreats. Keep that in your prayers. I wanted to give an update on Vision 2015 to let everyone know how we stand. Remember this was started in January of 2012. The goal of this vision was not just buildings and debt, but to see lives **INTENTIONALLY TRANSFORMED** through the Gospel of Jesus Christ!!! That is something that we are constantly working on through our themes and activities here at Hanging Rock. Every activity is truly a teaching opportunity and a tool to teach about Christ.

When we started this Vision we had 2 phases:

Phase I: \$220,000

- Eliminate camp indebtedness We only have \$76,000 left on our LDC loan!!! Praise the LORD!!!!
- Complete the Gene Farrow Memorial Bridge We are on our way to do this. The plan is to have this completed by the end of 2014.
- Build a new playground Completed.
- New Shelter house by playground- Not Completed
- Roof on the House of Eve **Completed**
- Create a permanent archery location Mission Crossfire is working on this.
- Develop Horse camp into year-round program We have 5 horses that live at the camp year-round now. We offer them to our retreats.
- Complete wilderness camp upgrades and get state approval Completed
- Explore the idea of day camps Still exploring
- Create partnership with Zimbabwe Outreach Ministries Started, I have made two trips and Tom has made one. We helped put a new roof on their dining hall in 2013.

Phase II \$230,000

- Remodel Chapel –Not started.
- Build new shop for maintenance Not Started.
- Turn LDC into activity building **Not Started**.
- New roof on Hilton and Commons Area **Not Started.**
- Remodel the two present shelter houses We will have these completed by the end of May of this year.
- Start a new Wilderness Program We have begun building and plan to start programs in the summer of 2016.
- Lower Camp Fees **COMPLETED!!!**
- Hire a 3rd full-time Director **Maybe sometime in 2016.**

We have had one major distraction to Vision 2015! We were challenged last year by the State of Indiana to upgrade our waste treatment plant which cost almost \$27,000. But with the help of our churches we were able to do that!!! We still have time to accomplish everything we have set forth in Vision 2015! If you are not a part of this vision please join us so that we can continue to move forward in INTENTION-ALLY TRANSFORMING LIVES through the Gospel of Jesus Christ!!!

Our original goal was \$450,000. Including money received and current commitments we will need another \$141,000 by the end of next year to make everything a reality.
