### Online Registration

On-line registration is great! You can go to [www.hangingrock.org](http://www.hangingrock.org) and click on the "On-line Registration" button to begin your online registration process. If you registered last year online, you will use the same login and password to access your account. By registering on line you must pay with your debit or credit card. For campers who's churches pay part or full amount, you will need to see your camp liaison to get your church bucks codes.

### Early-Bird Discount

To receive the EARLY-Bird DISCOUNT, our camp office must receive your completed form with payment or online registration on or before our Celebrate Good Times Day on Sunday, June 3, 2012. The Early-Bird price is listed next to each camp along with the regular camp fee.

### Cancellation Policy

For all on-site camps, fees are refundable with the **exception of \$25.00** if the camp office is notified of cancellation **at least one week before session starts. There will be no refund for off-site camps unless the vacated spot can be filled.**

### Residential Camps

Campers who attend Residential Camps enjoy air-conditioned dormitory style accommodations and home style meals in the camp Dining Hall. There is a recreation time everyday along with Bible Study, worship, and campfire devotions. Youth camps are structured for school grade beginning in the fall.

### Wilderness Camps

Campers attending Wilderness camps sleep in primitive cabins (no electricity or indoor plumbing) . Wilderness activities may include: fishing and paddle boats at the lake, wading in the creek, hiking, low rope challenge course, zip-line and rock wall climbing. All programs include Bible study, worship, and campfire devotions. 5-12th grades may schedule an off-site canoeing or tubing activity.

### Check-in and Pick up Procedures

Check-in and dismissal times are listed on this brochure. (Note: Indiana is on Eastern time. Start and End times are listed as EST.) If a camper needs to leave camp at other times, written permission must be received by the camp office. Upon departure, campers must sign out in the office or after hours in the First Aid station and sign back in when returning. **It is best that the camper does not leave camp while camp is in session.** At the end of each event, campers will be dismissed and checked out. Written parental permission must be given to the camp office if a camper is to leave with someone other than a parent or legal guardian.

### Come Early and Enjoy the Camp

This year we are offering you a time to come to camp and enjoy what God has so blessed us with. Beginning at 4:00 pm. The swimming pool will be open, also miniature golf, basketball, volleyball and hiking is available for your family. We will also be serving "Happy Camper Meals" which includes a hamburger or hot-dog, chips and cookie for \$3.00. Canteen will be open as well. You will not be allowed in any of the buildings. Bathrooms will be available. In case of rain, you may just want to come for registration.

### Directions to HRCA

From the south: turn north at exit 4 from I-74. Proceed on State Road 63 approximately 1.5 miles. Turn right onto 263 (runs parallel with 63) and travel 6 miles. Camp is on the left side of the road.

From the North: take highway 28 to junction 263. Proceed south on 263 through West Lebanon 4 miles. Camp is on the right side of the road.

### First-Aid/Medical Insurance

There will be a First-Aid attendant on duty for every camp. All camper medication is to be in ORIGINAL CONTAINERS and turned in to the First-Aid Attendant at camper check-in. Parent or guardian will be notified of camper illness or injury. Campers will be sent home if they have an above-normal temperature or if they are found to have head lice. Camper medical insurance is the primary coverage.

### Homesickness

Campers are encouraged with understanding and compassion to stay at camp and participate in the programs. We do not encourage campers to talk to parents or guardian on the telephone. However, camp personnel will communicate with the parent or guardian about the situation,

### Handi-Camp

Licensed nurses will dispense all medications and tend to the needs of the campers. Campers needing total care must be accompanied by an adult familiar with their individual needs.

### Family Camp

HRCA's Family Camp offers programming for the entire family. Activities include worship and praise sessions, campfire devotions, and workshops for adults, as well as a nursery, and youth and teen programs. Fees are a per-person fee and depend on whether you cook your own meals or you let the camp prepare your meals. Please see flyers for Memorial and Labor Day Family Camp for fees. Tents and RV welcome (electrical hookups available). Dormitory lodging available also.

### High School Adventure Camp

Take a trip off-site into the beautiful surroundings of Tennessee. Backpack the Appalachian Trail in a 3 night/4 day adventure. Go White water rafting. Visit the Smokey Mountains. Limited to 12 teens, grades 10-13. This is a Deeper Life Week that is meant for mature Christians.

### Mountain Bike Adventure Camp

Go biking in beautiful southern Indiana! Campers will leave HRCA on Sunday evening and travel by van to Tell City, IN where they will set up camp at Tipsaw Lake. Campers will spend their days biking in the area and will return to base camp each night. In addition to biking, activities will include swimming in the lake and a trip to Holiday World. Campers must provide their own mountain bike (in excellent condition) and will be required to wear a helmet. Bike must pass inspection during camp check-in or camper will not be allowed to participate. This camp requires strenuous physical activity. Camper must be willing and able to bike 10-12 miles a day.

### Paintball Camps

Paintball camp is guaranteed to be an action packed camp with three full days of paintball adventure. Each student will be issued a paintball marker, safety equipment, and paintballs to use while on campus. Campers will reside at our wilderness cabins. This camp is open to both girls and boys. Sign up early these camps are sure to fill up quickly!!

### Sports Camp

For campers who love sports! Sports Camp offers a great opportunity for you to focus on your game. We are add 2 new sports this year. **Flag football** is being added and will include a lot of regular football drills and skills workouts. **Cheerleading** is also being added. Other featured sports are: Basketball, Baseball, Tennis, Soccer, Volleyball and Golf. Campers participating in Tennis and Golf will need to bring their own equipment. Soccer players need to bring shin guards. Baseball players can bring their own gloves and any other equipment they want. All balls will be provided. Additional activities may include hiking, swimming, indoor rock climbing, zip-line and rappelling. Program will include Bible study, campfire devotions and worship.

### Horse Camps

Campers learn the proper care of horses, how to saddle, and proper riding techniques. Campers will work toward maneuvering up and down hills and trails. Additional activities will include hiking, swimming, indoor rock climbing, zip line and rappelling. Program includes Bible study, campfire devotions and worship. Campers **will need** riding boots or hard-soled shoes.
