From the Heart





Fifty years ago, Helen MacGregor birthed Trinity School of Cape Cod in obedience to the Lord. Her vision for a superior education bathed in grace and truth took root. The early years were critical to establish the firm foundation required for an enduring legacy. Scores of dynamic, God-fearing, Jesusloving board members, faculty and staff worked tirelessly to make Trinity into the best private, Christian K-8 school in Massachusetts. From Falmouth to Provincetown, families were drawn to the South Yarmouth campus because they knew glorious things happened within the humble walls of



four little cottages. The Dorothy Otis education building, the Red House, Pond St., and the Hunt Memorial Library pulsated with the love of the Lord and high expectations for learning. In those days we quoted John Rustin often: "When love and skill mingle, expect a masterpiece." Love and skill mingled at TSCC in remarkable ways. Love and skill still mingle today at TCA.
