Second Grade Summer Reading and Journaling

Dear Second Grade Families,

Research has clearly shown that children who do not read during the summer may lose up to three months of reading progress! Needless to say, I strongly recommend that your child read every day this summer. I have included a reading list for suggestions. Summer is the perfect time to explore your child's special interests. Do not limit their reading to books... recipes, maps, magazines, road signs, cereal boxes also are wonderful ways to keep your child reading.

Please have your child record the names of the books they read this summer.

In addition to reading, each student needs to complete a summer journal, to be handed in on the first day of school. The journal should include the following:

- 1. At least 10 dated entries, at least 2 sentences each
- 2. Each entry must include a drawing, photo, map or chart
- 3. Their best penmanship
- 4. Correct spelling and punctuation

Some suggestions:

If your child is wondering what to journal about, they may write about interesting books they are reading. If they love nature and science they could record observations of animals, insects or seashells. Dig in the dirt and record what they find. Did your family travel this summer? Journal your adventures and draw a map of your trip. *Be creative.... Have fun!*
