

OUR HISTORY

Trinity School of Cape Cod, as it was originally named, was established in January 1967 by four ministers and three laymen with a vision – a vision to provide a solid Christ-centered education for children in the region. When the doors first opened, the school welcomed pre-school and kindergarten students in two buildings owned by the Evangelical Baptist Church.

Over a period of 30 years, Trinity continued to add grades while expanding its footprint and program offering. By 2003 the school, by then named Trinity Christian Academy, had outgrown the church facilities. Through God's providence, Trinity was able to secure 6.9 acres of land in Barnstable and over a period of three years build two wings to house the expanded, fully accredited Pre-K through High School program.

While the school has certainly grown since those early days, we have always stayed true to our vision and mission:

Through the teaching of a dedicated Christian faculty, high academic standards, the foundation of Biblical truth, and a wholesome Christian environment, Trinity Christian Academy seeks to educate and equip its students to become productive citizens in our society for the glory of God.



TODAY'S CHALLENGES

Trinity has come so far over the past 45 years, but new needs have surfaced, especially the need for adequate space for key programs – critical programs that help to develop the whole student. We currently rent gym space and use community and local church facilities to accommodate our physical education classes, after school sports, and school events such as drama and musical performances.

Our library is also suffering due to the need to multi-purpose this space. On any given day the library also serves as a computer lab, Spanish classroom, study hall, accommodates the Yearbook class, and doubles as a meeting room. The sheer multitude of uses limit the number of books and computer stations we can house in this space.

And while Trinity's art room is adequate, it also doubles as a lunchroom for the Upper Level students and as a meeting room.

The time has come to embrace the next important step in Trinity's history – the addition of a new Creative Arts and Activity Center.

The proposed Creative Arts and Activity Center will not only add over 4,000 square feet to our facility, it will open up so many new possibilities for Trinity. The new center will provide a space for our students to gather, learn, grow, and belong.
