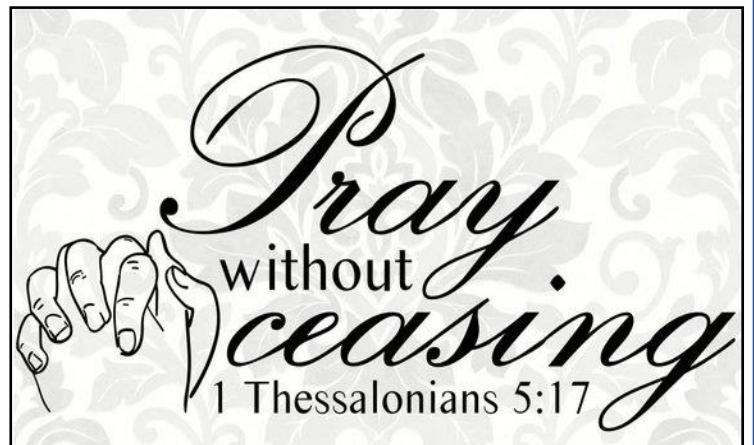

THE DETROIT ASSOCIATION OF WOMEN'S CLUB (C. 1921)



The Detroit Association of Women's Clubs, Inc. is a historic women's club established on April 8, 1921, by eight African-American women who banded together to focus on philanthropic, educational and social programs. It was incorporated in 1941. That same year, supported by a mortgage on its president's home, the association purchased its present clubhouse, a handsome Colonial Revival-style structure. The club members completely paid for the clubhouse in less than five years. It was solely for African American women and had roughly 3,000 members in 1945.

The home was purchased in 1941 and it was on Ferry Street. It was an affluent white neighborhood during that time and they didn't want black people living on their street. The club applied for an address change and even moved the door of the home from Ferry Street to Brush Street. It was a defining moment as they stood up against housing discrimination and racism in Detroit during that time by having this door moved to the other side and not moving the whole building itself. The address was changed to 5461 Brush Street where it is still located today.

The Detroit Association of Women's Clubs is a 501c3 non-profit organization that currently contributes to the needs of the community with various business partnerships, outreach programs for seniors, families, and youth through fundraising events, grants and charitable donations. The association sponsors girls' clubs, scholarships, annual clothing drives for needy school children, and charitable programs for seniors and the disadvantaged. Its motto is "Lifting As We Climb."

The club received a historical maker from the state of Michigan on October 26th, 1986. Their mission is, and continues today, to uplift and support the Detroit community.

“Prior to the 20th century, most African American Christian women commonly followed 1 Corinthians 11:6 and covered their heads in worship. For early African Americans, God’s house was not only a sanctuary of hope and salvation in a brutal world, but it was also one of the few places where they were allowed to hold important positions of leadership. Sunday was thus a day of worship and celebration. African American women traded in their drab aprons and knotted head wraps for brightly colored dresses and straw hats decorated with fresh flowers, ribbons and feathers. These heaven-reaching hats were designed to “catch God’s eye” in hopes He would hear their prayers.”
