Job Title: Police Chaplain

Job Qualifications/Expectations: Police Chaplain is a Full Time position. The Chaplain shall work with and under the direction of the Senior Chaplain and the Spokane Police Chaplaincy Board (SPCB). The Chaplain must be ordained, licensed, or commissioned by a religious body and have that body's approval to be eligible for chaplaincy service. Applicant shall meet the qualifications to obtain Basic I.C.P.C Certification or be able to obtain certification within one year of appointment. While the SPCB realizes that one's own faith and faith practices must be maintained according to one's church rules,

all chaplains shall serve ecumenically in a nondenominational and nonjudgmental environment. The Chaplain will serve a diverse constituency. Possessing a wide knowledge base of law enforcement culture would be desirable. The applicant must have two years experience in pastoral work, counseling, or law enforcement to cope with the needs of law enforcement personnel and community members.
