A Lasting Legacy

Praise be to the God and Father of our Lord Jesus Christ! In his great mercy he has given us new birth into a living hope through the resurrection of Jesus Christ from the dead, and into an inheritance that can never perish, spoil or fade. 1 Peter 1:3-4

As we celebrate 150 years of ministry at Stevensville United Methodist Church this year it seems appropriate to share some thoughts around words like legacy and inheritance. Christians living today didn't "discover" this life giving faith. We inherited it from generations of faithful disciples who came before us and passed it on.

Parents, pastors, Sunday school teachers, youth and choir directors, and numbers of other people nurtured us in the faith. They did so hoping that just as we inherited this faith, we would also pass it on to the next generations of believers.

Speaker and writer Michael Josephson writes: "When you die, your possessions will be distributed according to a will in which you allocate your property to specific people. Objects left in a will are called a legacy. But "legacy" also has a much deeper meaning. In Jewish tradition, people write "ethical wills" in which they pass on to the next generation, especially their children, the gift of wisdom and good wishes. This legacy is far more profound and permanent than bequests of property."

The inheritance of which 1 Peter speaks could be called an "ethical will." It could also be called a "spiritual will" which passes on to each successive generation of Christians the gift of salvation, wisdom, tradition, and teachings that help us to know who we are, why we are here, what we stand for, and how we should live. These precious gifts are indeed a priceless treasure that convey to us the amazing love, mercy, forgiveness, and grace of God that has been freely given to us in Christ.

Yet, no matter how wonderful this good news may be to receive, the challenge to each one of us as disciples is to determine how we will pass this legacy on to future generations. If we look at our own lives and think about what matters most, what would we write into our own ethical or "spiritual will"?

Much as this may be an individual challenge, it is also a corporate one for our church. 150 years ago a small group formed a Class Meeting in Stevensville. Over 150 years the class meeting grew into a Church, which has had at least two multiple buildings and additions. But more important is the "spiritual will" that has passed generation to generation.

When we move on from this place where we have worshiped, celebrated the sacraments, shared mission work and fellowship, what will we leave behind? Yes, there will be a piece of property and a great facility. But what will be the ethical or "spiritual will" we leave behind as a congregation? In other words, how do we, as a church, want to be remembered? What wisdom do we want to ensure those who follow us inherit?

According to Socrates, the touchstone of wisdom is to first know thyself. As the Administrative Council of SUMC begins to reflect on who and where we are, and what the community around us looks like, for what do we want to be known? Another way to frame it is this: What is our vision for not only living this life of faith, but passing it on to the next generations?

May God give us all the wisdom to leave behind not just a piece of land and some buildings, but a life giving gift that conveys the good news of which 1 Peter 1 speaks: "new birth into a living hope through the resurrection of Jesus Christ from the dead, and into an inheritance that can never perish, spoil or fade."

Thanks be to God for that great cloud of witnesses who have gone before us! Thanks to each of you still among us who seek to pass on our great inheritance in the Risen Christ!

One Hundred Fifty Years of Stevensville United Methodist Church (continued)

Around 1931 Mrs. Clara Meyers was pianist and names on the books were Stuart, Davis, Cupp, Cahlgard, and Griffendorf. From 1932 to 1941, we had five ministers. (In 1932, Rev. W. H. Watkins was appointed pastor. Rev. Paul Wilcox served as pastor in 1934; Rev. Orlo W. Carr in 1935 and Rev. F. E. Chamberlain in 1939. Rev. Henry Beatty, a young bachelor, was pastor in 1940 and 1941.) Rev. Emerson Minor came in June of 1941 and stayed for nine years. He was the longest resident pastor in history at that time.

In 1945, the minister wrote there were 76 members and only 38 could be relied upon. In 1947 a new concept was proposed at the Fourth Quarterly Conference on March 16. It was proposed that each member should make a pledge, assuming his financial responsibility of the church and that we look into the Envelope System of giving. That motion carried and the church started using this system in June of 1947 and is still in use.

In 1951, an energetic young man, Rev. H. H. Patterson came as our new pastor and remained for five years.

The church was growing in numbers with church membership totaling 103. Farm lands in the surrounding area began falling to the sub-division mania, which started the community toward its development into the suburban type of living. More houses being built at a staggering rate meant that more people needed spiritual homes. Far-sighted members appealed to the District Superintendent for guidance toward building a new church, but were told that a building program was impossible. The church did not feel that it was impossible, and in November of 1955, a general building fund account was set up.

Rev. Donald Strohl, his wife Dottie and two sons joined us in 1956. Growth in the area continued at a rapid pace, and talk about a new building became more frequent and more urgent.

In 1957, a building site of 3.3 acres was purchased on Ridge Road and in 1959 a building fund program was launched. Our church had been affiliated with other Methodist churches and shared pastors. We asked and were granted our own full time minister in June of 1960.

The fundraising was a success and the Groundbreaking Ceremony for the new church was held on September 16, 1962. In March of 1963, Rev. Strohl left and Rev. Wm. Pohly consented to be our interim pastor until June. Rev. Marvin Zimmerman came to our church in 1963. In 1965, the parsonage on Ponderosa Drive was purchased for more livable quarters for the pastor and his family. Mrs. Kenneth Warner organized a Youth Choir and Mrs. Michael Miles was the pianist.

When we moved into the church in 1963, our records indicated we had a membership of 292 members. In the year of 1967, the records showed membership as 424 members.

Please watch upcoming newsletters for more church history and information regarding the observance of our 150th Anniversary. We are seeking volunteers to be part of a team to help plan a celebration in the fall.
