Children of the Day

Monday's child is fair of face, Tuesday's child is full of grace
Wednesday's child is full of woe, Thursday's child has far to go,
Friday's child is loving and giving, Saturday's child works hard for a living,
Sunday's child is happy and wise.

The poem above may be far more familiar to our elders these days. I can recall my mother often repeating it, and being a Sunday Child I liked it. I wonder if mom would have told it, and if I would have liked it, if I'd been born on a Wednesday. As it turns out, with a little online research I learned the original line for Sunday read: "And that child is born on the Sabbath day is bonnie and blithe, and good and gay." I don't think I'd have liked that one as a child. What 6 year old would understand "bonnie and blithe"?

Titled "Monday's Child," the poem was first published in A.E. Brays book "*Traditions of Devonshire.*" Whether or not people took to heart it's foretelling the fortunes of children based on the day of the week they were, the tradition of doing so goes back much further than the poem. We are likely see it as superstitious nonsense, because it is.

In my office is a small framed picture that simply reads "*intrinsic worth.*" I obtained it from Rev. Chris Momany, son of Carol and Ron, and graduate of Adrian College which I also attended. Chris is the Campus Chaplain at Adrian, and in that position has been lifting up the history of the college which is rooted in the abolitionist movement. Adrian's first president, Asa Mahan, was an ordained minister and noted abolitionist who got in trouble a number of times due to his strong views. Chris wrote in an article a few years back:

"I was always drawn to [Mahan's] combination of spiritual depth and social justice. He wasn't someone who was either/or. He was both/and. The part of me that connects with God likes that, and so does the part of me that connects with social justice. Mahan's theme, which shows up in his writings, was "*intrinsic worth,*" that human beings have intrinsic worth that's God-given and part of one's identity, not based on things like wealth or social class."

For Asa Mahan every child born upon this good earth has intrinsic worth, and no one can think themselves "better" due to some social or economic status. All are made in the image of God. And all means ALL. Yet our fallen world clearly demonstrates that humanity hasn't fully accepted this fact. The statistics on child poverty in our nation alone show that, while we might nod in agreement with the sentiment of intrinsic worth, when it comes social policies it's another matter. Morality too often ends where our pockets start to be impacted. We're far from the bottom of the list of nations, but we are a good way from the top as well.

All this is why I am a supporter of "*The Children's Sabbath*" which we will be celebrating on Sunday, October 22nd. Worship that day will focus on the joy children bring into our lives and world, and will also challenge us to be more accepting, loving, caring toward the many children who may not be "our own" but nevertheless need our love. Christ said as much: "*Let the little children come to me, and do not stop them; for it is to such as these that the kingdom of heaven belongs.*" On the day of the Children's Sabbath, we will also be trying out "*Grace Space,*" (See pg. 7 for more detail) to show that all children have a place among us, even in worship. For every child has intrinsic worth not only in our world but in the Church, which is an outpost of the Kingdom of God.

No matter what day we were born on, no matter how the world may see us and others, let all of us seek to be "God's Child" gathered together in the one family to which Jesus invites ALL.

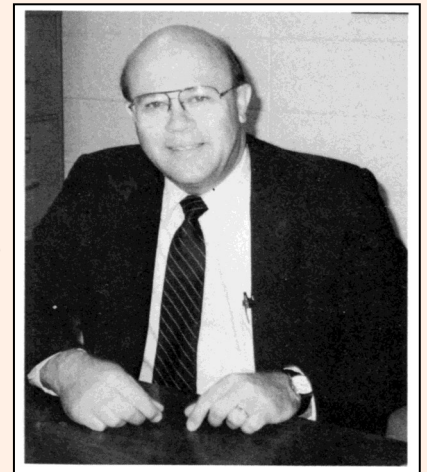
One Hundred Fifty Years of Stevensville United Methodist Church (continued)



1979 1st Addition of Stevensville United Methodist Church

On May 20, 1979, the new addition of Stevensville United Methodist Church was consecrated during the 11 a.m. worship service.

Rev. Dean Bailey came to our church in the middle of 1979 until 1987. In summer of 1979, a successful summer youth ministry was lead by Youth Minister, David Hills. Steve Emery was our Summer Youth Minister during the summer of 1980. Through the work of the Youth Minister Task Force the District Superintendent was notified that we could raise the funds to hire an Associate Pastor. Steve Emery was appointed as our Associate Pastor in June of 1981.



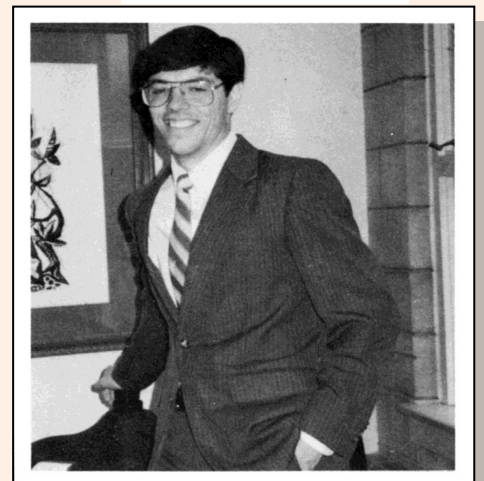
Rev. Dean Bailey
1979 - 1987

Pastor Bailey had received phone calls asking if the church was planning any involvement with the resettlement of the boat people. We had the opportunity and it was decided to sponsor a Laotian Refugee family, Chanthaboury's, in 1980. They stayed in the area until March of 1981 when they moved to Dorchester, MA.

In December of 1984 the opportunity to purchase 3.76 acres from the Israelites House of David was approved.

Purchasing of the land would be for:

1. Future expansion of facilities (Faith Hall)
2. Insure the opportunity for future growth at the church's desired rate and provide its mission to the community
3. Meet parking expansion needs (It was decided at the annual church conference, December 11, 1984, that the church could not grow without adequate parking facilities.)



Rev. Steven Emery
1981-1987

In October of 1985, a Building Needs Committee was created to analyze the needs of the church & community for future expansion. In October of 1986 a Building Committee was organized. A survey from the congregation compiled December of 1986 looked at not only present conditions of the church but towards future growth. In September of 1987, a contract was signed with an architect for a proposed schematic of the future addition. However, due to lack of funds, this expansion was halted until a building fundraiser was organized to help raise funds for this new addition.
