# To Everything, Turn...

Ecclesiastes 3:1 says: "For everything there is a season, and a time for every matter under heaven." Authored by King Solomon under the pen name "Kohelet," Solomon was not alone in his thinking. The ancient Greek philosopher Heraclitus of Ephesus is widely thought to be the first to say: "The only constant in life is change."

While statements about change may often have a bit of hyperbole, it's probably not as much as we'd like to think. We may be children of God, but we are also creatures of habit who are drawn to the familiar, the stable, the routine, the comfortable. We may get to experience those comforts for a time, maybe even a season, but *everything* changes eventually. It's in the very fabric of Creation.

In looking through some quotes on the topic of change I got reacquainted with Dr. Vicktor Frankl, the Austrian born neurologist, psychiatrist, and holocaust survivor. Frankl is probably best remembered for his 1946 book "Man's Search for Meaning." In very broad strokes Frankl believed that after our most basic human needs are met (ie. water, food, shelter, relationship), our deepest innate human need is to find "meaning" in life. I happen to believe our "need for meaning" is at the very heart of our spiritual yearning to find, experience, and know God.

On the issue of change, this is what Victor Frankl said:

"When we are no longer able to change a situation, we are challenged to change ourselves."

Why this quote from among so many others? Because I believe Frankl describes precisely where the Church, and where **our** church, finds itself in this time and place. At several if not many points over the 150 year life of this congregation, lay leaders and clergy have likely made changes because they discovered that "what we have always done" was no longer working. That's hardly unique to us. Since peaking in 1962 the percent of the US population who identify as "religious" has dropped from just over 80% to 69%, and over half of the decline happened since 2002. So the trend has accelerated. Some believe "evangelical" or "Bible-belt" churches have managed to avoid the decline. It looked that way for a time, but only because the decline started later. The decline is seen in every denomination, across broad theological spectrums. The exceptions are "new church starts" and "megachurches" I could say how, but it doesn't really apply. We aren't "mega" and many of us likely don't want to be. Nor are we "new" though we should "re-new" some things.

So have <u>any</u> established churches like ours found ways to grow in this season of wide-spread church decline? YES, some have. And it turns out that regardless of their denominational or theological identity or location, established churches that are thriving today didn't do it by trying to change the culture around them. Instead they intentionally took up Frankl's challenge to *"change themselves."* 

There is nothing wrong with wanting to change the world or culture around us for Christ, but to do so we have to learn to speak to the culture in which we live today. That means learning the language of the culture, rather than expecting the culture to learn our language. This does NOT mean changing the message of the Gospel! But it does mean changing the ways in which we communicate and share the Gospel. Even the Apostle Paul understood this when he went to Rome. (See Acts 17:16-34)

Bottom line? I'm going to need next months column and maybe the one after that to finish my larger point. But for now.. I still believe Frankl was right. I believe that people are still seeking "meaning" for their lives. Perhaps now more than ever. But the ways in which the church has traditionally shared the message of the Gospel that gives meaning to our lives is no longer as effective as it once was.

On our own, we can't change the culture around us. BUT, if we really believe what we say we do, and if we trust that the Spirit of Christ is with us and will lead us, we CAN choose to change "how" we share Jesus' good news with people in our community, which can make all the difference over the next 15 or 150 years.

The alternative is to keep doing things the same way, hoping for different results, which is one definition of insanity.

The Trustees will be reviewing specifications on appropriate qualifications for new candidates to replace Aza. Also, they will be reviewing the cost for the replacement of this dear faithful servant.

While a specific dollar amount is not know at this time and we are not yet starting a formal capital campaign, there have been requests to give to a fund designated for this purpose. Accordingly, the Generosity Team has established such a fund. If you would like to donate, mark your offering envelope "Boiler Fund". Please do not re-direct your current giving to the General Fund to this new account. We really do need your donations to keep the ministries of the church going through your General Fund offering. This new fund would be that little extra you might have and are willing to help the church. If by the grace of God, we receive more funds than what is needed to replace Aza, after all bills are paid, the extra funds will be moved to the General Capital Fund.

# One Hundred Fifty Years of Stevensville United Methodist Church (continued)



It was during Rev. Geoff Hayes' tenure (1987 to 1994) that funding became available for the new expansion. On June 28, 1992, there was a ground breaking ceremony of the Faith Hall addition. In the Fellowship



Footnotes of December 2, 1992, Geoff shared, "I pray for patience for myself and for you, too, as we learn to use this marvelous new tool for ministry. Faith Hall will change our life as a congregation, and some of the changes will take us by surprise. Let's thank God for this new challenge and ask Him for the wisdom, patience and courage to follow Him into the future He's creating for us." A Service of Consecration for Faith Hall would take place on December 20, 1992.

Rev. Geoff Hayes 1987-1994

We had four (4) Associate Pastors during Geoff Hayes' tenure: Rev. Larry Rubinaugh (1987 to 1988), Pastor Jeff Wright (1988 to 1990), Rev. Brad Barthelmay (1990 to 1993) and Rev. Tamara Williams (1993 to 2002)





Rev. Gene Lewis came to us in 1994 and retired in 2003. Before he left in 2003, he was instrumental in leading the church to purchase the property to Red Arrow Highway so the visibility of the church would be open to the highway. He wrote in the April 2003 Bulletin, "All that we have and are today is because of those of you who were not afraid to be foolish risk-takers for Christ".... "We believe there are vital ways this property can be used for ministry to the community. Is this a foolish plan? Maybe! However, I would rather risk being a fool for Christ's sake than just an ordinary fool which I have been far too many times!"

Rev. Terri Bentley came as our Associate Pastor from 2002 to 2008.
