#### Cupid Is As Cupid Does

It's February! Love is in the air! Cards are on the shelves! A semi-trailer of hearty candy runs down the center aisle of Meijer and Walmart, etc.. It seems there is never a day of the year when retailers aren't selling the next holiday, before the last one is even over. Now I'm not knocking holidays. They obviously don't bring the same excitement as when I was a child. But there is the joy of seeing your children and grandchildren delight in those occasions. One would have to be a Scrooge, or perhaps more appropriate to Valentine's Day a little devil, to want to gripe about candy hearts, Valentines cards, chocolates, etc.

Just a wee bit of history around St. Valentine's Day: It may be seen as a primarily secular holiday to many, but it is rooted in the Christian tradition. In the Western Christian Church it is celebrated on February 14. In the Eastern Orthodox Church it is celebrated on July 6<sup>th</sup>, or July 30<sup>th</sup>, and perhaps both! There are a number of martyrdom stories related to Saint Valentine of Rome, but obviously the most known and celebrated is that of Saint Valentine.

A popular account reports that St. Valentine was imprisoned for performing weddings for Roman soldiers who were actually forbidden to marry. In addition, he was found guilty of ministering to Christians who were persecuted under the Roman Empire. According to one legend, while imprisoned St. Valentine healed his jailers daughter, Asterius, and before he was executed, he wrote her a letter and signed it "Your Valentine."

We can thank Geoffrey Chaucer for associating romantic love with the Feast of St. Valentine. The association came in the 14<sup>th</sup> century, when the tradition of "courtly love" was quite popular. From there it evolved into a day for lovers to express their affection with confections, and/or flowers, cards, etc. In parts of Europe, St. Valentine's Keys have been given to lovers "as a romantic symbol and an invitation to unlock the giver's heart."

Jesus had a lot to say about love. It was more about sacrificial love than romantic love, but I believe both can be present and intertwined at times. Every marriage or romantic relationship that flourishes has some level of mutual sacrifice involved. What Jesus had to say is not unfamiliar to most of us: "Love the Lord your God with all your heart, mind, soul, strength, AND your neighbor as yourself. "Love one another as I have loved you."

This year Valentine's Day and Ash Wednesday happen to coincide, falling on the same date. It may seem odd but there is a spiritual link. Lent is a journey of remembering all that Jesus came to do for us and all humanity. What Jesus did for us was obviously born of His love for us. His "Passion" as we refer to it at times was the ultimate act of self-giving love. If that's not love, I don't know what is. Love is as love does. Christ's love was freely given to us. It is a Valentine written for everyone. Perhaps among other things, the St. Valentine's Key is the key to the heart of God, who wants us in turn to open our hearts as well. Love is as love does. So just do it, with Jesus, with one another, even with the neighbors. Spread the love!

#### MESSAGE FROM THE GENEROSITY COMMITTEE

In order to improve awareness of the state of our finances, we have decided to begin producing a quarterly narrative report in which we intend to highlight important issues and trends. This is our first such report and will cover the first half of our fiscal year through 12/31/17. SUMC financial statements include several different funds. By far the largest is the General fund. Most of the offering received each week is directed into the General Fund. For the six months ended 12/31/17, a total of \$167,781.00 was received by and \$164,428.00 was spent by the General Fund, resulting in a year to date surplus of \$3,353.00. This is good. Our only concern with General fund spending is that just three Categories: (1) Staff Expense (2) Trustee/Property Expense and (3) Ministry Shares account for 93% of the total, leaving only 7% or \$10,473.00 for everything else. So when good ideas emerge for improving our Ministry in areas such as: Education, Youth, Music, Membership Care, and Outreach, we are often forced to say that no money is available. Perhaps with your help this situation will improve during the next six months.

The next largest fund is the SUMC Children's Center. For the six months ended 12/31/17, this fund recorded \$118,027.00 of revenue and incurred \$123,679.00 of expense, resulting in a year to date deficit of \$5652.00. This is a negative change from prior results. During the year ended 6/30/17 the Children's

Center generated a surplus of well over \$40,000.00 allowing them to invest approximately \$35,000.00 in badly needed new playground equipment. The previous playground structure no longer met State-mandated guidelines. The SUMCC Board, led by Kellie Meyer, has recently changed its billing procedure and has openings in their toddler and preschool rooms. With our low tuition rates and our Christian-based curriculum, we would expect to be dealing with a waiting list, not with a shortage of students. You can help your church immensely by referring any friends or relatives with young children to the SUMC Children's Center. Another important fund is Missions, which is essentially a pass-through fund. For the six months ended 12/31/17 it received \$19,455.00, the main sources being: (a) monthly mission giving (b) donations to UMCOR and (c) the Christmas offering. There are several other much smaller funds, but neither time nor space allow discussion of them all.

One final comment. Detailed statements are produced each month by our Financial Secretary, Sara Lawrick. Members of the congregation are always welcome to request a copy from Sara.

On February 12, Sisters In Faith will hold a book discussion "Refuges" by Alan Gratz. It is a novel for young adults. It will be held in the Gathering area at 7:00pm. The following review is about the book:

Every once in awhile a book comes along and you just know that this is one everyone should read. The author has created a compelling look at refugees throughout history and done it in a way that young readers will find compelling. As an adult reader, I was thoroughly blown away by the similarities between the three stories the author features (Nazi German, Cuba in the 1990's and Syria in 2015). Given the current political climate, this book resonated with me in a totally unexpected way. Each young person's story is delivered in a way that is guaranteed to keep readers on the edge of their seats as each child faces death not only for themselves but also their family members. Their experiences are disturbing and the author's storytelling so vivid that it really shows the horror of war and the power of political oppression through the eyes of a child. The author deftly weaves the stories together, periodically switching between the three in a way that seems totally natural......The violence is real and peril is vivid. By J.
