We understand the purpose of a religious community somewhat differently here, The church you want is three blocks down the street.'

The couple left and drove down the street three blocks. There they found an abandoned and boarded up church building, a dead church, gone out of business."

When someone comes up to us and asks what it means to be a part of the Stevensville United Methodist Church, our answer is that we are striving to be a community of faith in which we have an inward look and caring for one another, as well as an outward look that calls us to be concerned with God's people all over the world. We continually work on our mission to "Be an instrument of God's love" in some unique and wonderful ways here at SUMC! We have definitely NOT gone out of business, but are clearly striving to do God's business!
