From the Pastor...

Walker Chapel United Methodist is located at the north end of Glebe Road in Arlington, Virginia, and just a mile from the Chain Bridge crossing the Potomac River into Washington D.C. The church looks like most of the architecture in the area with it's colonial flavor.

I became acquainted with the church in 1974/75 when I started attending while in the Honor Guard. I found a place working with the youth which soon turned into "home" away from Michigan.

Working with the youth led to deeper ties with some of the families and it wasn't long before you would of thought I had grown up there! One thing led to another and God kept working on me. When I finally heard the call to ordained ministry and seminary, I went back to work at Walker Chapel as a seminarian.

I was thinking about this as I was looking at my file of Christmas bulletins that I have kept since 1980. You look at the quality of paper, print and graphics from back then and wonder how did we ever survive? I am very fortunate that every one of those Christmases has wonderful and special memories: special music, wonderful decorations, and sacred memories of people and relationships in each congregation. They have all been silent nights and holy nights.

One of the most sacred times for me has been to return to those sanctuaries after the services are over, the people have left, and before I lock up, I sit alone in the darkness with a candle burning. I prayerfully think of what has just happened to all of the lives that have been there to worship, sing carols and light the candles as they sang "Silent Night".

The story that became real so long ago, has become real once again in the sanctuaries of churches thousands of miles from Bethlehem, centuries later in time. I so look forward to this coming Advent and Christmas season for God's love story will become real once again and you and I will be there!

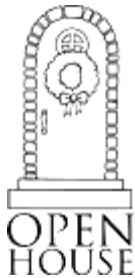

Recognition for Rev. Wade Panse

On Sunday, December 11th, Pastor Wade Panse will be honored for his many years of service to the St. Joseph First United Methodist Church.

A program will be held in the Sanctuary at 1 P.M. There will be testimonials as well as video and musical tributes. The Rev. Neil Davis, our District Superintendent, will be one of the speakers during the program. In addition, an Open House from 12:00-1:00 and from 2:00-3:00 will be held in the Fellowship Hall. Light hors d'oeuvres will be served during the Open House. Please join with us in this tribute, which will be a fun and meaningful time.

Financial Update

Four months into the new fiscal year which began on July 1st, things are going well.

General Operations – *Income is right at the budgeted level of \$106,000. Expenses are well below the budgeted level at \$93,000. The various ministry teams are doing an excellent job of providing all planned programs while being financially prudent.*

Missions – *A total of \$5,000 was raised specifically for missions. These designated funds plus the \$17,000 budgeted as part of our general fund budget for this 4-month period are used to support a variety of local and world-wide mission efforts.*

Sanctuary Renovation – *A little over \$12,000 in sanctuary renovation pledges were received during this 4-month period. We remain on track for paying off the loans on time.*

Children's Center – *Income ran at 127% of expenses for this 4-month period. The staff and board of the Children's Center continue to provide this high quality ministry in an efficient manner.*

This mission has an 81 year history providing quality care to children who live at the center until they are reunited with their families or adopted by a loving couple. During their stay at the center, children learn from professionals about issues regarding neglect, physical & sexual abuse, drugs, etc.

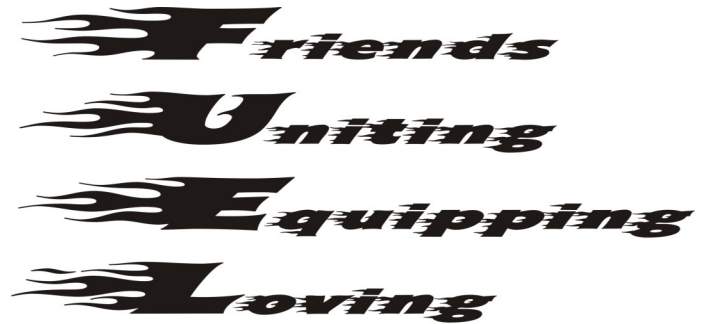
