CATECHISM, CATECHETIC, CATECHIZATION...

With the introduction of The Congregation at Prayer in our bulletin, and the addition of certain instruction in our school and confirmation classes, a question has arisen. What is "catechesis, catechumen, catechism, etc.? Here is a quick overview of these words which you may have been hearing more of lately.

The terms catechism, catechetics, catechization, etc., are derived from a Greek word meaning "to instruct orally". Later they came to have the idea of oral instruction by questions and answers. The practice of catechetical instruction began in the early Christian Church when great numbers of people were coming forward to be baptized. Most of the people coming forward were adults who needed instruction in the Christian faith. This teaching lasted for two to three years before they were baptized. Later the baptized children of Christian parents were received as catechumens in preparation for confirmation.

Very brief definitions:

- Catechesis The teaching of the fundamentals in the Christian faith
- Catechumen The student
- Catechist The teacher
- Catechism A handbook for instructing the catechumen

Christians are disciples of Jesus -<u>catechumens</u>- for life, not just for a few years of confirmation instruction. Christians learn from His Word continuously as they sit together at Jesus' feet in the Christian Congregation and in the Christian home.

The Order of Meditation and Prayer

Welcome to THE CONGREGATION AT PRAYER!!! The Congregation at Prayer (CaP) is a devotional tool designed to deepen a culture and disciplined prayer and catechesis in the congregation. The CaP places our list of weekly prayers (heretofore found on p.3 of the bulletin) within the context of a simple order of prayer that can be used by any one. The CaP in this section will have a summary of the week's readings, and in a similar box at the end will have a summary of next week's reading. In this way you can have a reminder of what we heard from the Lord on the weekend and, with the summaries for the upcoming week, help prepare to hear the Word the next week. This discipline will help you better "read, mark, learn, and inwardly digest" the Word of God!

John 2:1-12. The Wedding at Cana. The sermon for September 14, 2014 finds its basis in the Wedding at Cana. Jesus' presence at the wedding and His conduct there indicate his blessing of marriage, but what does that really mean? To answer this question and understand God's design for the family we will look at an extensive outline about the purpose of marriage. This is foundational material for ALL discussion about family life and the host of social issues that surround it. You will be challenged.

Pray and confess out loud as much from the order of meditation and prayer as you are able, or as your family size and ages dictate. Learn by heart the verse, catechism, and hymn of the week.

Genesis 3 records man's fall into sin, the "corrupting of God's design." This passage succinctly summarizes the vast array of the fall's implications, from death to marital discord to societal and environmental degradation. In the midst of this horror, however, is a very precious promise, and a preview of God's redemptive act.

Ephesians 2.1-9 makes clear both what our nature "in Adam" is and how it is that we can be rescued from the consequences. To God alone be glory!

Matthew 12.46-50 is a bit of a follow-up to Part 2: Marriage. We have a tendency to idolize family. This account from St. Matthew reminds us, as Ephesians 2.1-9 does, of where our hope resides.

THE FOURTEENTH SUNDAY AFTER PENTECOST

John 2:1-12 ~ ESV

On the third day there was a wedding at Cana in Galilee, and the mother of Jesus was there. Jesus also was invited to the wedding with his disciples. When the wine ran out, the mother of Jesus said to him, "They have no wine." And Jesus said to her, "Woman, what does this have to do with me? My hour has not yet come." His mother said to the servants, "Do whatever he tells you."

Now there were six stone water jars there for the Jewish rites of purification, each holding twenty or thirty gallons. Jesus said to the servants, "Fill the jars with water." And they filled them up to the brim. And he said to them, "Now draw some out and take it to the master of the feast." So they took it. When the master of the feast tasted the water now become wine, and did not know where it came from (though the servants who had drawn the water knew), the master of the feast called the bridegroom and said to him, "Everyone serves the good wine first, and when people have drunk freely, then the poor wine. But you have kept the good wine until now." This, the first of his signs, Jesus did at Cana in Galilee, and manifested his glory. And his disciples believed in him.

After this he went down to Capernaum, with his mother and his brothers and his disciples, and they stayed there for a few days.
