

The activities below will help your children remember and apply the lesson they learned this week. Plan some time to do each of these together as a family.

### **BIBLE STORY: EXODUS 2: 1-10**

Read the story of God's promise to never flood the earth again in Genesis 8:1-9:3. Tell your child that every time God made a promise in the Bible, He kept it and He still keeps it. God promised Noah and his family that He would never destroy the earth with a flood again and God has kept that promise. God will always keep His promises.

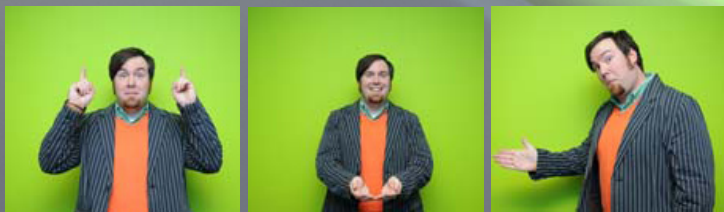
#### **ACTIVITY 1: ICE CUBE PAINTING**

Make some ice cube crayons by pouring water into an ice cube tray then adding 8-12 drops of food coloring to each section. You can place craft sticks in each section to serve as a handle for your painting. Freeze the tray overnight. When we get ready to paint, cover the table with newspaper and get started on your painting. You direct your child to paint a rainbow with the ice cubes. Talk about the promise that God made to never destroy the earth with a flood again. God keeps His promises to us!

#### **ACTIVITY 2: MAKE A PROMISE**

Make a promise to your child this week. It might be to take them for an ice cream cone or simply that you will play a game with them one night before bedtime. Pick one thing and promise that to your child using the words "I promise I will." Make a point to keep the promise. When you have finished doing what you promised your child you would do, remind them that just like you kept your promise, God will also keep His promises to us. We can read about God's promise by reading the Bible and by going to church.

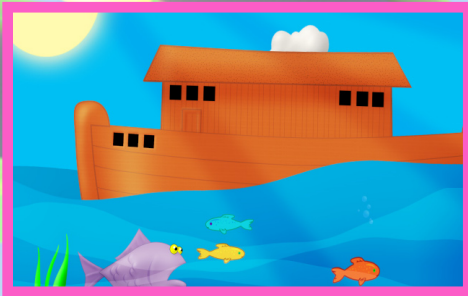
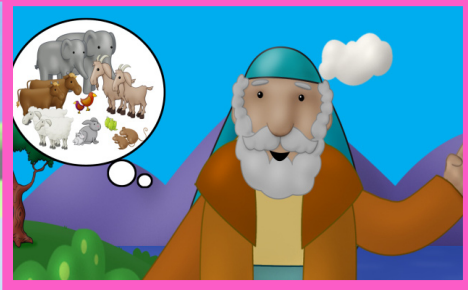
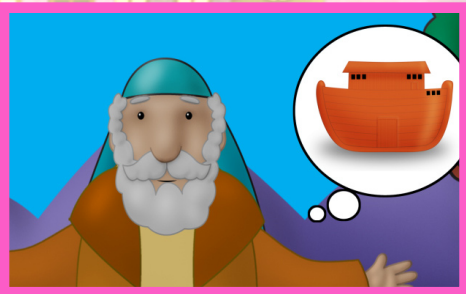

# **God Will Keep His Promises!**

## **Lesson 6**

Use the pictures and text below to retell the Bible Story to your children. Some questions and answers are included to help you gauge their remembrance and understanding of the story.



**Did God tell Noah to build an ark?**

*(Yes.)*

A long time ago, God told Noah to build an ark. The ark was to be 450 feet long, 75 feet wide, and 45 feet tall. It was huge!

Then God told Noah to put two of every kind of animal in the ark because He was going to flood the earth. God promised Noah, that he and his family and all the animals would be safe on the ark.

**Did God keep His promise to keep Noah and his family safe from the flood?** *(Yes.)*

It rained hard for 40 days and 40 nights. The water grew deeper and deeper and finally covered the earth. Noah and his family were safe in the ark though like God promised.

When the rains stopped, the wind began to blow. The waters went away and the land dried up. It took a long time, but the ground was finally dry again and it was safe for Noah and his family and the animals to leave the ark.

**Was the rainbow a promise?** *(Yes.)*

God made one more promise to Noah and his family. God said that He would never destroy the earth again with a flood. God also said that they could remember His promise when they saw a rainbow in the sky. So when you see a rainbow, you can remember that God keeps His promises.
