May 2017--Church World Service (CWS) Assembly - On April 20 about forty volunteers gathered at Bullens warehouse in Eaton to assemble cleanup buckets and school kits for CWS. Two hundred school kits and 228 buckets were readied for shipment to the Brethren Service Center in New Windsor, MD. The cleanup buckets are given to flood survivors within the United States. The school kits are distributed within the US and sent abroad for refugees, the economically disadvantaged, the homeless, and for disaster survivors.

New Carlisle Church seeks Musician

Church musician needed for the New Carlisle Church of the Brethren starting June 18, 2017. Responsibilities are to play for the Sunday morning 10:30 service and to accompany the adult choir rehearsal, Wednesday evenings, 7:30-8:30, during the choir season. The choir sings the 2nd and 4th Sundays of the month and each Sunday of Advent and Lent.

The service music duties include a Focus which is a short piece played soon after the service starts. It should be about a minute in length or slightly longer. There is also an Offertory and Postlude. The sanctuary has a keyboard, Hammond organ, and a piano.

The position also involves accompanying the congregational singing on the keyboard. The songs are a blend of contemp-orary and traditional hymns. There is a small group of instrumentalists that plays with the congregational singing and the keyboard. The

instruments include two trumpets, a horn, 2 acoustic guitars, flute, clarinet, violin, small percussion, and a soprano who leads the singing. The group is directed by the associate pastor who also arranges some of the music. The musicians are accomp-lished with several holding music degrees. The pay for this position is \$50 per Sunday and \$50 per choir rehearsal.
