Bethany and EYN Form Educational Partnership

Bethany Theological Seminary and EkklesiyarYan'uwa a Nigeria (EYN, Church of the Brethren in Nigeria) have entered into an historic relationship, the first of its kind between the Seminary and a Church of the Brethren group outside the United States. At the 2016 Annual Conference, Bethany president Jeff Carter and EYN president Joel Billi signed a Memorandum of Understanding which outlined a new intercontinental online education program. Conceived as a way to facilitate theological study at Bethany for EYN members, the program is a joint effort between the Seminary and EYN.

It is hoped that this innovative program will create a pathway for more EYN students to enroll as degree students and study on campus at Bethany. Courses taken for the CATS can be transferred directly into the master of divinity or master of arts program at Bethany. As EYN moves from a state of crisis to one of greater independence after enduring widespread violence and destruction at the hands of Boko Haram, this educational partnership can help strengthen the leadership, mission, and ministry of a resilient and growing denomination.

Disaster Ministry Updates

CWS Project Update: 504 Cleanup Buckets

In response to the hurricanes in Texas, Florida, and Puerto Rico, our district worked together to respond to the need. 504 Cleanup buckets for Church World Service (CWS) were assembled on October 19 by 96 volunteers, ranging in age from three to 91+ years. They represented thirteen COB congregations, plus several other churches. With many hands working, the buckets were filled with fourteen different items and stacked on skids in less than an hour. What an amazing evening, truly a God moment for many who were helping. These buckets were shipped to the Brethren Service Center in New Windsor, MD, arriving there on October 25. From there they will be shipped to the point of need. S. Ohio BDM stepped out in faith as we undertook this project. District churches were invited to set their own goal, knowing the scope of the project. CWS values the buckets at \$75, but we have consistently assembled them for less. About \$33,000 has been received to fund this project. Not all bills have been turned in, so we don't yet have the total cost of the project. Donations have definitely exceeded the cost of 504 Cleanup Buckets. We are checking with Church World Service and Brethren Disaster Ministries to see what the need is for additional buckets, kits, or supplies. Thank you to everyone who has helped with this project. Together we are sharing God's love by helping those in need.
