Disaster Ministry Updates

Hygiene Kit Assembly Scheduled – On Thursday, May 10 at 7:00 PM there will be an assembly of 1,000 hygiene kits for Church World Service (CWS). The assembly will be at Mill Ridge Village Community Center, 1000 Mill Ridge Circle, Union. CWS has requested hygiene kits because their inventory is low due to the hurricanes in 2017. The hygiene kits will be shipped to the Brethren Service Center in New Windsor, MD.

Opportunity for Youth – Sign up Now! Youth BDM trips to Lumberton, NC are set for June 10-16 and July 8-14. Youth fifteen years and older are invited to help rebuild homes damaged by Hurricane Matthew. It isn't necessary to have building skills, just a willingness to learn and serve. Project Updates/Volunteers Needed – A new BDM site has opened in Lumberton, NC for recovery from Hurricane Matthew, which hit in October 2016. USVI Response – Category 5 hurricanes, Irma and Maria, struck the Virgin Islands in September 2017. BDM has been supporting the recovery in the US Virgin Islands (USVI) through the Disaster Recovery Support Initiative (DRSI) program. There, our staff have been walking with and mentoring the St. Thomas Recovery Team (STRT) as they are planning their recovery. STRT is now ready to welcome volunteers and BDM has three 2-week time periods in 2018 reserved for BDM volunteers to work in the USVI on St. Thomas. Those weeks are June 17-30, September 9-22, and December 2-15. There are 12 spots open each of the 2-week periods for volunteers from all districts on a first come basis. Housing, transportation on island, tools and meals will be provided during these 2-week time periods. Volunteers must be able to work in warm climates and some of the work during the June trip will likely include mucking and gutting homes. S. Ohio BDM will be working on partial reimbursement of airfare for volunteers serving during these weeks. More information will be available after the May 3 BDM meeting. Adult Mental Health First Aid

New Carlisle Church of the Brethren will host "Adult Mental Health First Aid: Older Adult Module Course" training on Saturday, May 5, 2018 from 8:00 AM-5:00 PM. Mental Health First Aid teaches a five step action plan to offer initial help to people with signs and symptoms of a mental illness or in a crisis, and connect them with the appropriate professional, peer, social, or self help care. Participants that complete the full training will secure a three year certification. The cost is \$30.00, includes 8 hours of training, a comprehensive manual and a box lunch provided by Bowman Landes.
